Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funding for to the Neighborhoods Department - Municipal Code Compliance Division for a Neighborhood Blight and Cleanup pilot program in the Brentwood neighborhood, as more particularly described in Exhibit 2 attached hereto. The purpose of the Neighborhood Blight and Clean-up pilot program is to create a successful road map with specific investments of infrastructure and clean up assistance in a neighborhood with high amounts of identified blighted structures to result in a reduction of crime and an increase in quality of life for the residents. This program will bring together Municipal Code Compliance (MCC), Public Works, and Parks, Recreation and Community Services, to work with the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office, on these investments. A successful Blight and Clean-up program will result in the creation of jobs, increased community pride, and a tracked and proven reduction in crime.

Section 3. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
