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5 **RESOLUTION 2021-37**

6 A RESOLUTION COMMENDING DR. DIANA GREENE ON
7 BEING NAMED THE 2021 FLORIDA SUPERINTENDENT OF
8 THE YEAR BY THE FLORIDA ASSOCIATION OF
9 DISTRICT SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENTS; PROVIDING AN
10 EFFECTIVE DATE.

12 **WHEREAS**, this year, Dr. Diana Greene was named the 2021
13 Florida Superintendent of the Year by the Florida Association of
14 District School Superintendents, making her the 33rd superintendent
15 and second African-American woman to receive this honor; and

16 **WHEREAS**, Dr. Diana Greene became the Superintendent of Duval
17 County Public Schools on July 1, 2018. Prior to her work in Duval
18 County, she was the Superintendent of the School District of
19 Manatee County, where she made significant strides forward
20 academically, financially and in terms of its public perception;
21 and

22 **WHEREAS**, during her 33-year career as an educator, Dr. Greene
23 spent time as a teacher, assistant principal, and principal; and
24 also worked in curriculum development, staff development and in
25 senior executive leadership. The Duval County Schools 2019 school
26 grades reflect remarkable growth, two-thirds of the district's low
27 performing schools - those that earned a "D" or an "F" in 2018,
28 improved by one or more letter grades in the 2018-19 school year,
29 and the number of "A" rated schools in the district grew by almost
30 thirty percent. The District scored a historic number of points on

1 Florida's Accountability Scorecard and now sits just a fraction of
2 a percentage point from an "A" rated designation; and

3 **WHEREAS**, as DCPS Superintendent, Dr. Greene personally
4 reviewed every high school for safety, leading to the plans for the
5 installation of high definition security cameras throughout each
6 facility and improved perimeter fencing at many schools. Dr. Greene
7 has taken several steps to improve the stability and public
8 perception of the District's finances. She advocated for the half-
9 penny sales tax to improve all school facilities over the next 10-
10 15 years, which Duval County voters approved in November by 67
11 percent. The sales tax revenue will go towards building upgrades
12 and renovations, making schools functional and safer, and improving
13 academic outcomes, while reducing operational costs. The District
14 has also completed a financial transparency web page that provides
15 easy public access to budgets, audits and financial reports; and

16 **WHEREAS**, under Dr. Greene's leadership, and with the support
17 from board members, staff, parents, and business and community
18 leaders, Duval County Public Schools has seen impressive progress
19 in the district graduation rate - almost ten percentage points,
20 from 76.6 percent in 2014-2015 to 86.5 percent in 2018-2019.
21 Additionally, the achievement gap between white and African
22 American students has decreased, and the graduation rates for
23 Hispanic students, and students with disabilities, have increased;
24 and

25 **WHEREAS**, Diana Greene grew up living in locations all over the
26 United States as the daughter of an Air Force father, and later as
27 a Navy spouse; Dr. Greene is also a proud parent of two outstanding
28 adult children; now therefore

29 **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

30 **Section 1.** The City of Jacksonville hereby congratulates
31 Dr. Diana Greene for her dedication to education and public

1 service, and for striving to make a positive difference in
2 children's lives every day. City Council commends Dr. Greene for
3 her achievements as Duval County Schools Superintendent and
4 celebrates her for this well-deserved honor of being named Florida
5 2021 Superintendent of the Year.

6 **Section 2. Effective Date.** This Resolution shall become
7 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
8 without the Mayor's signature.
