WHEREAS, notice of the City of Jacksonville's intent to use the uniform method for the levy, collection, and enforcement of a non-ad valorem assessment, as described herein, has been published pursuant to Section 197.3632, Florida Statutes, and the required public hearing has been held; now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Statement of Intent and Legal Description. The City of Jacksonville hereby states its intent to use the uniform method for the levy, collection, and enforcement of a nonvalorem assessment for certain residential solid collection services, commencing January 1, 2021, as authorized by, and defined in, Chapter 382 and Chapter 715, Ordinance Code, and Ordinances 2010-446-E and 2010-673-E. The legal description of the area subject to such non-ad valorem assessment is the General Services District of the consolidated City of Jacksonville, as defined in Section 7.16, Florida Statutes, and Article 2 of the Charter of the City of Jacksonville, less and except Urban Services Districts 2, 3, 4 and 5, also known as the Cities of Jacksonville Beach, Atlantic Beach, and Neptune Beach and the Town of Baldwin, as more particularly described in the Charters of such local governments, and incorporated herein by reference.

Section 2. Statement of Need. The City of Jacksonville hereby states the need for a non-ad valorem assessment for certain residential solid waste collection services, as authorized by, and defined in, Chapter 382 and Chapter 715, Ordinance Code, and Ordinances 2010-446-E and 2010-673-E, to fund the cost of providing such certain residential solid waste collection services, and the uniform method for the levy, collection, and enforcement of such a non-ad valorem assessment is the most efficient and cost effective method of collection of all the collection options that may be

available to the City of Jacksonville.

Section 3. Distribution by Legislative Services. Pursuant to Section 197.3632(3)(a), Florida Statutes, Legislative Services is hereby directed to mail a copy of this Resolution, as adopted, to the Property Appraiser, the Tax Collector, and the State of Florida Department of Revenue, Property Tax Oversight Division.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
