ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$3,865,827.00 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) FUNDING FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING DEVELOPMENT AND URBAN AUTHORIZED ΒY THE CORONAVIRUS AID, RELIEF, AND ECONOMIC SECURITY (CARES) ACT TO BE USED TO PREVENT, PREPARE FOR, AND RESPOND TO THE CORONAVIRUS PANDEMIC (COVID-19) BY PROVIDING AID AND ASSISTANCE TO ELIGIBLE LOW- AND MODERATE- INCOME INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES, OR THOSE WHO LIVE IN AREAS DESIGNATED AS LOW- AND MODERATE- INCOME, TO MITIGATE THE IMPACTS OF COVID-19, AS INITIATED BY REVISED B.T. 21-023; INVOKING THE EXCEPTION SECTION 126.107(G), ORDINANCE CODE, ALLOW DIRECT CONTRACTS WITH CHANGING HOMELESSNESS, INC. AND EDWARD WATERS COLLEGE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2020-2021 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above is an appropriation of Community Development Block Grant funds in the amount of \$3,865,827.00 from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) authorized by the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act (CDBG-CV funds).

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide aid and assistance to prevent, prepare for and respond to COVID-19 by mitigating its impact on eligible low-and moderate- income individuals and families, or those who live in areas designated as low- and moderate- income. CDBG-CV funds are intended for short-term use (up to six months) by eligible recipients for mortgage and rental payment assistance, homeless service provision, public service grants, economic development projects, and public facility improvements that meet a HUD-defined national objective. These funds may also be used to cover or reimburse allowable costs incurred by a locality before the award of funding, including allowable costs incurred prior to the signing of the CARES Act. In addition, up to twenty percent (20%) of CDBG-CV funds may be used for administrative costs.

Section 3. Invoking the exception to Section 126.107(g), Ordinance Code. The City is hereby authorized to procure the use of the professional services of Changing Homelessness, Inc. and Edward Waters College, to provide services for Community Development Block

Grant Coronavirus Assistance (CDBG-CV). Pursuant to Section 126.107(g) (Exemptions), Part 1 (General Regulations), Chapter 126 (Procurement Code), Ordinance Code, such procurement is exempted from competitive solicitation because the supplies or services are to be provided by those specifically prescribed within authorizing legislation that appropriates the same. With the exception of the foregoing, all other provisions of Chapter 126, Ordinance Code, shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
