Creating a Section 380.512 (Annual new Report), Part 5 (Recycling Program), Chapter 380 (Solid Waste 16 17 Management), Ordinance Code. Section 380.512 (Annual Report), Part 5 (Recycling Program), Chapter 380 (Solid Waste Management), 18 Ordinance Code, is hereby created to read as follows: 19 20 CHAPTER 380. SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT. 21 * * * 22 PART 5. RECYCLING PROGRAM. * * * 23 24 Sec. 380.512. Annual Report. 25 The Director shall prepare an annual report to the Council 26 concerning the City's recycling program. The report shall be filed 27 on or before March 1st of each calendar year and shall summarize activities related to the recycling program during the previous 28 29 fiscal year. The Transportation, Energy and Utilities Committee shall review the annual report and may take legislative action to 30 address recycling conditions contained within the annual report, as 31

1	appro	priate. The information contained in the annual report shall
2	inclu	de, but not be limited to, the following items:
3	(a)	all efforts undertaken by the City during the prior fiscal
4		year to establish recycling of all materials that are
5		financially attainable in the City;
6	(b)	the number of written complaints pertaining to the recycling
7		program submitted to the City during the prior fiscal year;
8	(C)	the statistics as to the number of materials recycled broken
9		out by different types (i.e., plastic, glass, cardboard,
10		<u>etc.);</u>
11	(d)	the collaborative efforts undertaken by the City with third
12		parties, such as the Duval County School Board, to maintain
13		recycling in the City;
14	(e)	the public education efforts undertaken by the City to
15		encourage the recycling of materials which are financially
16		feasible within the City;
17	(f)	the total expenditure of the City's recycling program,
18		including revenues received from the sale of recycling
19		materials, costs incurred to dispose of materials that were
20		put in the recycling stream but were not recyclable,
21		estimated savings that the recycling program provides to the
22		City by reducing materials that are landfilled, overall costs
23		of the collection of recyclables, and any other significant
24		costs or savings attributable the recycling program;
25	(g)	the performance standards utilized by the City to measure
26		compliance with this Part and with standards for recycling in
27		City contracts;
28	(h)	recommendations for improvement to the recycling program;
29	<u>(i)</u>	certification that the City is using the best practices in
30		its recycling program; and
31	(j)	any other information requested by Council, or considered
