5 AN ORDINANCE MAKING CERTAIN FINDINGS AND AUTHORIZING: (1) THE BORROWING OF UP TO AN 6 7 ADDITIONAL AMOUNT OF \$41,500,000 IN ADDITION TO THE BORROWING AUTHORIZED BY ORDINANCE 8 2020- FOR THE LOT J DEVELOPMENT PROJECT, TO 9 10 PROVIDE IMMEDIATE FUNDING FOR CERTAIN CIP 11 PROJECTS THROUGHOUT THE CITY AND (2) THE APPROPRIATION OF \$41,500,000 OF BORROWED FUNDS 12 TO MOVE UP THE FUNDING OF AND PROVIDE 13 ADDITIONAL FUNDING FOR CERTAIN PROJECTS 14 INCLUDED IN THE CITY'S FIVE YEAR 2021-2025 15 CIP; REVISING ORDINANCE 2020-505-E, THE CITY'S 16 FIVE YEAR 2021-2025 CIP TO MOVE UP THE 17 FUNDING OF AND PROVIDE ADDITIONAL FUNDING FOR 18 CERTAIN PROJECTS ENUMERATED HEREIN; REQUESTING 19 THAT THE FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION DEPARTMENT 20 ADMINISTER THE BORROWING AUTHORIZED HEREIN; 21 22 PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Jacksonville, Florida (the "Council") is considering Ordinance 2020-____ to authorize funding for borrowing up to \$208.3 million for the Lot J Development Project ("Lot J") and also to finance the construction of certain infrastructure improvements for Lot J, as more fully described in Ordinance 2020- ; and

WHEREAS, the Lot J project is lauded to strengthen the local 1 2 economy by adding to the workforce and contributing to the development of surrounding neighborhoods but meanwhile other road, 3 4 transportation and infrastructure projects are needed throughout Jacksonville as evidenced by the projects contained in the City's 5 2021-2025 Capital Improvement Plan ("CIP") and water/wastewater 6 7 systems projects continue to need additional funding over a period 8 of many years; and

9 WHEREAS, strategic investment in infrastructure projects and 10 water/wastewater systems projects throughout the community would 11 also benefit the City by adding employment opportunities to 12 construct such projects and would render the areas where these 13 improvements are made more attractive to future economic 14 development; and

WHEREAS, the Council desires to authorize additional borrowing permitted in Ordinance 2020-____, up to an additional \$41.5 million for the particular projects ("City-wide Improvements") indicated in Exhibit 1 attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein; and

WHEREAS, the Council finds that the additional borrowing for the City-wide improvements will provide significant economic benefits to the City and its residents by providing increased economic activity and will spur development in those areas in the City of Jacksonville and thus constitutes a valid governmental undertaking of the City for municipal purposes; and

WHEREAS, the authorizing of additional borrowing to undertake the City-wide Improvements is in the public interest and the financial assistance contemplated herein take into account and give consideration to the long-term public interests and public interest benefits to be achieved by the City; now therefore

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BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Findings. It is hereby ascertained, determined, found and declared as follows:

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(a) The recitals set forth herein are true and correct.

4 (b) The City-wide Improvements will promote and further the5 public and municipal purposes of the City.

Enhancement of the City's tax base and revenues, are 6 (C) 7 matters of State and City policy and State and City concern in order that the State and its counties and municipalities, including 8 9 the City, shall not continue to be endangered by unemployment, 10 underemployment, economic recession, poverty, crime and disease, 11 and consume an excessive proportion of the State and City revenues 12 because of the extra services required for police, fire, accident, 13 health care, elderly care, charity care, hospitalization, public 14 housing and housing assistance, and other forms of public 15 protection, services and facilities.

(d) The provision of additional borrowing is necessary and appropriate to make the City-wide Improvements feasible; and the City's assistance is reasonable and not excessive, taking into account the extent of the public benefits expected to be derived from the City-wide Improvements, and taking into account all other forms of assistance available.

(e) The authorizations provided by this Ordinance are for public uses and purposes for which the City may use its powers as a county, municipality and as a political subdivision of the State of Florida and may expend public funds, and the necessity in the public interest for the provisions herein enacted is hereby declared as a matter of legislative determination.

(f) This Ordinance is adopted pursuant to the provisions of
Chapters 163, 166 and 125, Florida Statutes, as amended, the City's
Charter, and other applicable provisions of law.

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Section 2.

Authorizing Additional Borrowing and City-wide

Improvements. The City is hereby authorized to borrow, in addition 1 to the borrowing authorized by Ordinance 2020- , an additional 2 3 maximum amount of up to \$41,500,000 for purposes to fund the City-4 wide Improvements as described in Exhibit 1.

5 Section 3. Appropriation. For the 2020-2021 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the 6 7 indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b): 8

15 (c) Explanation of Appropriation: The funding above 16 appropriates \$41,500,000 of borrowed funds that will be used to move up funding and provide additional funding for various City-wide improvements.

Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in 19 Section 4. Section 3 is to move up funding totaling \$2 million in each 20 21 district (with the exception of District 11 who has total funding of only \$500,000 in the 5-year CIP, including the 5th year and 22 23 beyond column) for projects included in each of the Council 24 districts of the FY 2020/21 Five Year Capital Improvement Program 25 to the FY 2020/21, for a total of \$26.5 million. In addition to the 26 \$26.5 million, the proposed borrowing includes additional funding 27 of \$15 million for the Water/Waste Water System project for septic 28 tank phase-out.

Section 5. 29 CIP Amendment. Ordinance 2020-505-E, being the 2021-2025 Five-Year Capital Improvement Program for the City and 30 certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to provide 31

funding for the projects indicated in **Exhibit 1.** The Council finds 1 that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next 2 annual budget and CIP review will be detrimental to the best 3 4 interests of the community because such deferral will result in the 5 City's loss in economic opportunities and economic development 6 result in the implementation of the City-wide which will 7 Improvements. Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, enactment of this ordinance requires the affirmative vote of two-8 thirds of the Council members present at the meeting because of the 9 CIP amendment set forth in this section. This ordinance shall 10 constitute an amendment to Ordinance 2020-505-E. In all other 11 respects, the Five-Year Capital Improvement Program approved by 12 Ordinance 2020-505-E shall continue in full force and effect. 13

Section 6. Oversight Department. The Finance and
Administration Department shall provide oversight for the manner of
borrowing permitted herein to complete the City-wide Improvements.

Section 7. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
