DIANA GREENE ON 7 8 BEING NAMED THE 2021 FLORIDA SUPERINTENDENT OF 9 YEAR ΒY THE FLORIDA ASSOCIATION THE OF DISTRICT SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENTS; PROVIDING AN 10 11 EFFECTIVE DATE. 12 13 WHEREAS, this year, Dr. Diana Greene was named the 2021 Florida Superintendent of the Year by the Florida Association of 14 15 District School Superintendents, making her the 33rd superintendent and second African-American woman to receive this honor; and 16 17 WHEREAS, Dr. Diana Greene became the Superintendent of Duval County Public Schools on July 1, 2018. Prior to her work in Duval 18 she was the Superintendent of the School District of 19 County, 20 Manatee County, where she made significant strides forward 21 academically, financially and in terms of its public perception; 22 and 23 WHEREAS, during her 33-year career as an educator, Dr. Greene spent time as a teacher, assistant principal, and principal; and 24 25 also worked in curriculum development, staff development and in 26 senior executive leadership. The Duval County Schools 2019 school 27 grades reflect remarkable growth, two-thirds of the district's low

28 performing schools - those that earned a "D" or an "F" in 2018, 29 improved by one or more letter grades in the 2018-19 school year, 30 and the number of "A" rated schools in the district grew by almost 31 thirty percent. The District scored a historic number of points on Florida's Accountability Scorecard and now sits just a fraction of
a percentage point from an "A" rated designation; and

Superintendent, Dr. Greene personally 3 WHEREAS, as DCPS reviewed every high school for safety, leading to the plans for the 4 5 installation of high definition security cameras throughout each facility and improved perimeter fencing at many schools. Dr. Greene 6 7 has taken several steps to improve the stability and public perception of the District's finances. She advocated for the half-8 9 penny sales tax to improve all school facilities over the next 10-15 years, which Duval County voters approved in November by 67 10 percent. The sales tax revenue will go towards building upgrades 11 12 and renovations, making schools functional and safer, and improving academic outcomes, while reducing operational costs. The District 13 has also completed a financial transparency web page that provides 14 easy public access to budgets, audits and financial reports; and 15

WHEREAS, under Dr. Greene's leadership, and with the support 16 from board members, staff, parents, and business and community 17 leaders, Duval County Public Schools has seen impressive progress 18 19 in the district graduation rate - almost ten percentage points, 20 from 76.6 percent in 2014-2015 to 86.5 percent in 2018-2019. 21 Additionally, the achievement gap between white and African 22 American students has decreased, and the graduation rates for 23 Hispanic students, and students with disabilities, have increased; 24 and

WHEREAS, Diana Greene grew up living in locations all over the United States as the daughter of an Air Force father, and later as a Navy spouse; Dr. Greene is also a proud parent of two outstanding adult children; now therefore
