The Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department (PRCS) respectfully request Legislation to apply for five (5) 2021 Florida Inland Navigational (FIND) grant projects. On an annual basis, the City of Jacksonville applies to the Florida Inland Navigation District for grant funding for specific waterways-related projects through their Waterways Assistance Program. FIND grants fund both the design and construction phase of projects as well as acquisition projects. The project development costs are shared 50% by FIND and 50% by the City, while FIND contributes 25% for acquisition projects which is matched by 75% from the applicant. Internal project management fees charged by Public Works are ineligible expenses for reimbursement through FIND.

PRCS has developed a list of recommended 2021 FIND grant projects that was presented to the Jacksonville Waterways Commission on December 9, 2020. Authorization from City Council is now needed to submit grant applications for these projects. The recommended projects are Goodbys Creek Dredge Construction (CD 5 & 6), Castaway Island Preserve Dredge (CD 13), Riverview Park Boat Ramp (CD 8), Exchange Club Island Park Development (CD 1) and Reed Island Park Development (CD 2).

These five (5) grant applications total \$3,905,000.00 (\$1,775,000.00 reimbursable from FIND and \$2,130,000.00 from City's match including internal engineering fees). If these applications are awarded by FIND, the grant agreements will require legislation to amend the CIP and authorize execution of the grant agreements.

These five (5) grant applications total \$3,905,000.00 (\$1,775,000.00 reimbursable from FIND and \$2,130,000.00 from City's match including internal engineering fees). If these applications are awarded by FIND, the grant agreements will require legislation to amend the CIP and authorize execution of the grant agreements. FIND grants fund both the design and construction phase of projects as well as acquisition projects. The project development costs are shared 50% by FIND and the 50% by the City, with exception of acquisition projects which are 25% from FIND and matched by 75% from the applicant. Internal Public Works fees for these projects are an ineligible expense for reimbursement through FIND. Grant agreements allow two years to complete the project and the City can request one additional year, if needed. Upon completion of the construction projects, City staff will take over maintenance responsibilities of the new facilities.


