ΑN ORDINANCE RELATING TO PUBLIC ORDER AND SAFETY; AMENDING CHAPTER 614, ORDINANCE CODE; CREATING Α NEW SECTION 614.102 (LARGE GATHERINGS PROHIBITED) TO PROHIBIT LARGE GATHERINGS AS IT RELATES TO PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY; CREATING A NEW SUBSECTION DEFINING "LARGE GATHERINGS" AS 50 OR MORE INDIVIDUALS ON OR NEAR PUBLIC RIGHTS-OF-WAY OR BUILDINGS; CREATING A NEW SUBSECTION (OWNER'S CONSENT REQUIRED; NOTICE OF PROHIBITED LARGE GATHERINGS; SUNSET PROVISION ON DECEMBER 31, 2021) THAT PROVIDES THAT THE OWNER, LESSEE, MANAGING AGENT OR PERSON IN CHARGE BUILDING OR PROPERTY MAY AUTHORIZE A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER TO REASONABLY REQUEST A PERSON TO LEAVE THE BUILDING OR PROPERTY AND MAY BE SUBJECT TO A \$500.00 CIVIL PENALTY FOR FAILING TO DO SO; CREATING A NEW SUBSECTION (EXCEPTIONS) TO EXEMPT INDIVIDUALS WHO RECEIVE APPROVAL FOR SPECIAL EVENT PERMITS AND INDIVIDUALS EXERCISING FIRST AMENDMENT RIGHTS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

a pandemic due to the outbreak of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, to reduce the spread of COVID-19, the Federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ("CDC") recommends practicing social distancing and minimizing personal contact with large gatherings; and

WHEREAS, the Jacksonville City Council seeks to minimize opportunities for person-to-person spread of the COVID-19 virus by coordinating enforcement efforts with owners of properties where large gatherings occur in order to advance public health and safety of the community; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Chapter 614 (Public Order and Safety),

Ordinance Code, amended. Chapter 614 (Jacksonville Public Order

and Safety), Ordinance Code, is hereby amended to create a new

Section 614.102 (Large Gatherings Prohibited) to read as follows:

## CHAPTER 614 PUBLIC ORDER AND SAFETY

\* \* \*

## Sec. 614.102. - Large Gatherings Prohibited.

- (a) Large Gatherings are defined as 50 or more individuals standing or sitting closer than six (6) feet from each other, outside of a completely-enclosed structure, in or near any public right-of-way, property or building in the City for business or social purposes, and which prevents the safe ingress, egress or through-passage of individuals in a public right-of-way, on a property or near a building, where the public has a right of access, in violation of this Section.
- (b) Owner's Consent required; Notice of Prohibited Large Gatherings; Sunset provision on December 31, 2021. (i). The owner, lessee, managing agent or person in charge of a building or property shall prohibit unpermitted Large Gatherings and may authorize a law enforcement officer to reasonably request

individuals to move or leave the public right-of-way, building or property if any person within a Large Gathering is sitting or standing in the public right-of-way, near a building or on the property without consent. (ii). Whenever law enforcement has responded to 2 or more Large Gatherings at a property, building or public right-of-way, and the Owner fails to prohibit the Large Gathering, a law enforcement officer shall issue a first warning to the Owner notifying the Owner that he/she is in violation of this Section, and that any subsequent violation shall be subject to a \$500.00 civil penalty. Unless otherwise extended or terminated by the Council, this legislation shall sunset on December 31, 2021.

- (c) Exceptions. The provisions of this Section shall not apply to outdoor gatherings authorized for (i) Special Events pursuant to Chapter 191, Ordinance Code, (ii) individuals exercising First Amendment rights of the United States and the Florida Constitution, such as freedom of religion, freedom of speech and the right of assembly; and (iii) any bona fide athletic event, government-sanctioned activity or any other event where COVID-19 precautions are implemented and enforced.
- (d) For the purpose of this Section, the word "building" shall be deemed to include, but not be limited to, retail or service establishments such as restaurants, convenience stores, laundromats, service stations and other similar establishments open to the public.

\* \* \*

Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
