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## ORDINANCE 2021-22-E

8 AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$200,000 FROM THE 9 SOCIAL JUSTICE AND COMMUNITY INVESTMENT 10 SPECIAL COMMITTEE CONTINGENCY FOR THE 11 JAXCARECONNECT PROGRAM (\$80,000 TO WE CARE JACKSONVILLE, INC. AND \$120,000 TO SIX CLINICS 12 13 (\$20,000 TO EACH CLINIC)); APPROVING, AND 14 AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND 15 CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER, 16 AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE 17 AND WE CARE JACKSONVILLE, INC.; INVOKING THE 18 EXCEPTION IN SECTION 126.107(G), ORDINANCE 19 CODE, TO ALLOW DIRECT CONTRACT WITH WE CARE 20 JACKSONVILLE, INC. TO PROVIDE THE SERVICES FOR JAXCARECONNECT; APPROVING, AND AUTHORIZING THE 21 MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND CORPORATION 22 23 SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER, AGREEMENTS BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE AND AGAPE 24 25 COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTER, INC., WESTJAX 26 OUTREACH DBA COMMUNITY HEALTH OUTREACH, MUSLIM 27 AMERICAN SOCIAL SERVICES (MASS), MISSION 28 HOUSE, I.M. SULZBACHER CENTER FOR THE 29 HOMELESS, INC. AND VOLUNTEERS IN MEDICINE; 30 INVOKING THE EXCEPTION IN SECTION 126.107(G),

ORDINANCE CODE, TO ALLOW DIRECT CONTRACT WITH THE SIX CLINICS; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE OFFICE OF GRANTS AND CONTRACT COMPLIANCE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

7 Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2020-2021 fiscal year, 8 within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the 9 indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to 10 the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation - The funding above is being
appropriated from the Social Justice and Community
Investment Special Committee Contingency and to be
utilized by We Care Jacksonville, Inc. and to provide
funding to six clinic sites for the JaxCareConnect
program.

23 Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in 24 Section 1 is to provide funding for JaxCareConnect, as more fully 25 described in Exhibit 2 attached hereto. The JaxCareConnect program 26 will provide funding to enhance the interoperability in 27 collaborative member Electronic Health Records System (\$30,000); 28 add a third Patient Health Advocate in Year 1, including salary, 29 benefits and equipment (\$50,000); and, support capacity building at 30 each of the six clinic sites to optimize clinic workflows, offer training, and add staffing hours (\$20,000 per clinic for a total of 31

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\$120,000).

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2 Agreement approved and execution authorized. Section 3. There is hereby approved, and the Mayor, or his designee, and 3 Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, 4 5 the Funding Agreement between the City of Jacksonville and We Care Jacksonville, Inc., in substantially the form as attached hereto as 6 7 File, and incorporated herein by this reference On (the "Agreement"). The Agreement may include such additions, deletions 8 9 and changes as may be reasonable, necessary and incidental for carrying out the purposes thereof, as may be acceptable to the 10 Mayor, or his designee, with such inclusion and acceptance being 11 evidenced by execution of the Agreement by the Mayor, or his 12 designee; provided however, no modification to the Agreement may 13 increase the financial obligations or liability of the City to an 14 amount in excess of the amount stated in the Agreement or decrease 15 the duties and obligations of We Care Jacksonville, Inc. as stated 16 in the Agreement, and any such modification shall be technical only 17 and shall be subject to appropriate legal review and approval by 18 19 the Office of General Counsel. For the purposes of this Ordinance, 20 the term "technical changes" is defined as those changes having no 21 financial impact to the City and any other non-substantive changes 22 that do not substantively increase the duties and responsibilities of the City under the provisions of the Agreement. 23

Invoking the exception to Section 126.107(g), 24 Section 4. 25 Ordinance Code. The City is hereby authorized to procure the use of 26 the professional services of We Care Jacksonville, Inc., to provide 27 services for the JaxCareConnect program. Pursuant to Section 126.107(g) (Exemptions), Part 1 (General Regulations), Chapter 126 28 (Procurement Code), Ordinance Code, such procurement is exempted 29 30 from competitive solicitation because the supplies or services are to be provided by those specifically prescribed within authorizing 31

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1 legislation that appropriates the same. With the exception of the 2 foregoing, all other provisions of Chapter 126, Ordinance Code, 3 shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 5. Agreements approved and execution authorized. 4 5 There is hereby approved, and the Mayor, or his designee, and Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, 6 7 the Service Agreement between the City of Jacksonville and six clinics (Agape Community Health Center, Inc., WestJax Outreach dba 8 9 Community Health Outreach, Muslim American Social Services (MASS), 10 Mission House, I.M. Sulzbacher Center for the Homeless, Inc., and Volunteers in Medicine), in substantially the form as **On File** with 11 the Legislative Services Division, and incorporated herein by this 12 provide services 13 reference (the "Agreement") to for the JaxCareConnect program. The Agreements may include such additions, 14 15 deletions changes as may be reasonable, necessary and and incidental for carrying out the purposes thereof, as may be 16 17 acceptable to the Mayor, or his designee, with such inclusion and acceptance being evidenced by execution of the Agreements by the 18 Mayor, or his designee; provided however, no modification to the 19 20 Agreements may increase the financial obligations or liability of 21 the City to an amount in excess of the amount stated in the 22 Agreements or decrease the duties and obligations of the six 23 clinics as stated in the Agreements, and any such modification 24 shall be technical only and shall be subject to appropriate legal review and approval by the Office of General Counsel. For the 25 26 purposes of this Ordinance, the term "technical changes" is defined as those changes having no financial impact to the City and any 27 28 other non-substantive changes that do not substantively increase the duties and responsibilities of the City under the provisions of 29 the Agreement. 30

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Section 6. Invoking the exception to Section 126.107(g),

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Ordinance Code. The City is hereby authorized to procure the use of 1 2 the professional services of six clinics (Agape Community Health 3 Center, Inc., WestJax Outreach dba Community Health Outreach, Muslim American Social Services (MASS), Mission House, I.M. 4 5 Sulzbacher Center for the Homeless, Inc., and Volunteers in Medicine) to provide services for the JaxCareConnect program. 6 7 Pursuant to Section 126.107(g) (Exemptions), Part 1 (General Regulations), Chapter 126 (Procurement Code), Ordinance Code, such 8 procurement is exempted from competitive solicitation because the 9 supplies or services are to be provided by those specifically 10 prescribed within authorizing legislation that appropriates the 11 12 same. With the exception of the foregoing, all other provisions of Chapter 126, Ordinance Code, shall remain in full force and effect. 13

14 Section 7. Oversight. The Mayor is requested to appoint 15 the Office of Grants and Contract Compliance to oversee the project 16 in Section 2 above and to ensure compliance with all other 17 appropriate laws.

18 Section 8. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become 19 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 20 without the Mayor's signature.
