AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$110,196.28 FOR FINAL DESIGN ENGINEERING PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS SERVICES FOR THE REPLACEMENT OF BRIDGE NUMBER 724039 ON 5TH STREET OVER SIX MILE CREEK (THE "PROJECT"), AS INITIATED BY B.T. 21-050; PURPOSE OF APPROPRIATION; AMENDING THE 2021-2025 FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN APPROVED BY ORDINANCE 2020-505-E TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR THE PROJECT; PROVIDING FOR CITY OVERSIGHT BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS, ENGINEERING AND CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT DIVISION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Intersection Improvements, Brge-Bridges account to the 5<sup>th</sup> Street Bridge Replacement project account in the amount of \$110,196.28 to pay for final design engineering plans and specifications services for the Project.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to pay for final design engineering plans and specifications services for the replacement of a two-lane concrete bridge (Bridge Number 724039) located on 5th Street between Ellis Road and Edgewood Avenue North near Six Mile Creek (the "5th Street Bridge"). The Florida Department of Transportation evaluated the 5th Street Bridge and determined that it is load rated and structurally deficient and requires replacement. The final design services will also include acquisition of necessary permits, preparation of construction plans and bid documents, and final design phase and technical/constructionability reviews.

Section 3. Capital Improvement Plan Amendment. Ordinance 2020-505-E, adopting the 2021-2025 Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan (the "CIP") for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to provide funding for the Project, as more fully described in the Project Information Sheets, attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference. The City Council finds that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next annual budget and CIP review will be detrimental to the best interests of the community because such deferral would result in the unnecessary delay of critical transportation infrastructure repairs and upgrades to the 5th Street Bridge. Adequately maintaining the City's bridge structures is a critical component of ensuring that its infrastructure is safe and reliable for the citizens of Jacksonville. The Project will correct structural deficiencies and bring the 5th Street Bridge into compliance with the current design standards.
