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## ORDINANCE 2021-152-E

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$5,825,311.00 IN COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT FUNDS FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT AUTHORIZED BY THE CORONAVIRUS AID, RELIEF, AND ECONOMIC SECURITY ("CARES") ACT TO BE USED TO PREVENT, PREPARE FOR, AND RESPOND TO THE CORONAVIRUS PANDEMIC ("COVID-19") BY PROVIDING AID AND ASSISTANCE TO ELIGIBLE LOW-AND MODERATE- INCOME INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES, OR THOSE WHO LIVE IN AREAS DESIGNATED AS LOW-AND MODERATE- INCOME, TO MITIGATE THE IMPACTS OF COVID-19, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 21-044; PURPOSE OF THE APPROPRIATION; INVOKING THE EXCEPTION OF SECTION 126.107(G) (EXEMPTIONS), PART 1 (GENERAL REGULATIONS), CHAPTER 126, (PROCUREMENT CODE), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ALLOW FOR A DIRECT CONTRACT WITH DOWNTOWN VISION, INC.; APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER ON BEHALF OF THE CITY AN AGREEMENT WITH DOWNTOWN VISION, INC. FOR THE PROVISION OF SERVICES DESCRIBED IN ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DIVISION, NEIGHBORHOODS DEPARTMENT; PROVIDING FOR COMPLIANCE WITH ALL CARES ACT GRANT FUNDING REQUIREMENTS AND OTHER REQUIREMENTS AS

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PROVIDED BY LAW; REQUESTING EMERGENCY PASSAGE UPON INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2020-2021 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above is an appropriation of Community funds in Development Block Grant the amount \$5,825,311.00 from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") authorized by the CARES Act (the "CDBG-CV Funds"). The CDBG-CV Funds will distributed as follows: (i) \$4,000,000.00 retained by the projects related to City for acquisition and rehabilitation of permanent supportive housing; \$1,500,000.00 retained the by City for foreclosure prevention services; (iii) \$150,000.00 to Downtown Vision, Inc. to fund the Life Builders Ambassador Program; and (iv) \$175,311.00 retained by the City to cover administrative costs incurred by Community Development Housing and Division for administration of permanent supportive housing projects

and mortgage foreclosure prevention services.

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Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide aid and assistance to prevent, prepare for and respond to COVID-19 by mitigating its impact on eligible low-and moderate- income individuals and families or those who live in areas designated as low- and moderate- income. The CDBG-CV Funds may be used for short term (up to 6 months) mortgage and rental payment assistance, homeless services, public service grants, economic development projects, and public facility improvements that meet a HUD-defined national objective. These funds may also be used to cover or reimburse allowable costs incurred by the City before the award of funding from HUD, including allowable costs incurred prior to the signing of the CARES Act. A copy of the HUD CDBG-CV Funds award letter is attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 3. Invoking the exception to Section 126.107(g), Ordinance Code. The City is hereby authorized to procure the use of the professional services of Downtown Vision, Inc. ("DVI") to provide Community Development Block Grant Coronavirus assistance services (the "CDBG-CV Services") through its Life Builders Ambassador Program. Pursuant to Section 126.107(g) (Exemptions), 1 (General Regulations), Chapter 126 (Procurement Code), Ordinance Code, such procurement is exempted from competitive solicitation because the supplies or services are to be provided by those specifically prescribed within authorizing legislation that appropriates the same. With the exception of the foregoing, all other provisions of Chapter 126, Ordinance Code, shall remain in full force and effect. The Scope of Work and Program Budget more particularly described in **Exhibit** 3, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, designates the CDBG-CV Services to be performed by DVI as a subrecipient/subcontractor for

the City.

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Section 4. Authorizations. The Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver on behalf of the City an agreement with Downtown Vision, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$150,000.00, subject to the Scope of Work and Program Budget more particularly described in Exhibit 3, and all other contracts and documents, including extensions, renewals and amendments to the agreement, and otherwise take all action necessary to effectuate the intent of this ordinance, subject to appropriate legal review and approval by the General Counsel, or his or her designee, and the City's Risk Management Division for appropriate insurance and indemnification requirements in accordance with Section 128.601, Ordinance Code.

Section 5. Oversight department. The Housing and Community Development Division, Neighborhoods Department shall provide oversight of expenditure of the CDBG-CV Funds and the CDBG-CV Services to be provided by Downtown Vision Alliance, Inc.

Section 6. Compliance with applicable CARES Act grant requirements. Downtown Vision, Inc. will comply with all CARES Act grant requirements in providing the CDBG-CV Services described in this ordinance, and all other requirements provided by law including, but not limited to, the audit requirements attached hereto as Exhibit 4 and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 7. Requesting emergency passage upon introduction pursuant to Council Rule 4.901. Emergency passage of this legislation is requested upon introduction. The nature of the emergency is that the negative economic impacts of COVID-19 are ongoing and immediate economic assistance is needed to ensure eligible individuals and families can retain their homes.

Section 8. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective

without the Mayor's signature.
