Section 1 is to appropriate a grant from the National Center for State Courts for a Proof of Concept project on remote jury selection. The NCSC selected the Duval County Court Administration, one of six courts, to conduct a pilot project to demonstrate the extent to which access to internet-enabled devices and unlimited data facilities the ability of prospective jurors to participate in jury selection through remote jury selection. The grant is so that the courts can purchase internet-enabled devices for use in the pilot program. The courts may exercise discretion as to the specific types of brands of devices or to offset expenses associated with conducting the pilot project, including but not limited, to devices to boost internet connectivity.

Section 3. Requesting One Cycle Emergency Passage Pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. One cycle emergency passage of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that the courts selected for the grant have a timetable to implement the program and there is a trial set for April that can be part of the pilot project and the courts need to be able to purchase the items needed before then.

Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
