Bill Summary: The bill appropriates funds in the sum of \$761,250.00 to provide pass-through federal grant funding through FDOT from the Highway Planning and Construction Federal-Aid Highway Program, Federal Lands Highway Program to reimburse the City for its participation in the construction of sidewalk improvements on Cedar Point Road from east of Grover Road to west of Boney Road. Background Information: The City Council finds that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next annual budget and CIP review will be detrimental to the best interests of the community because such deferral will result in unnecessary delay of the Project and loss of grant funding for the Project. Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, enactment of this Ordinance requires the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the City Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP amendment set forth.

Policy Impact Area: Sidewalk Construction Funding

Fiscal Impact: FDOT has agreed to reimburse up to \$761,250.00 for the construction of the aforementioned sidewalk. The City will not incur any additional debt as a result of this agreement.
