Bill Summary: This bill amends Chapter 118 (City Grants), Section 118.104 (Categories of Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs), *Ordinance Code*, to establish the 2021-2022 Categories for the Public Service Grant Appropriations.

Background Information: The Public Service Grant Council (PSGC), at their regular meeting on February 22, 2021, approved the budget and the Categories for Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs (MVPN) for FY 2021-2022. The percentages and three categories approved are:

- Priority Need A: Acute (35%) Services focused on adult individuals and/or families experiencing a
 difficult or dangerous situation requiring prompt action to avoid further deterioration of health, safety, or
 welfare.
- Priority Need B: Prevention and Diversion (40%) Services focused on preventing negative changes to health, safety, or welfare of adult individuals and/or families; or services designed to divert adult individuals and/or families who have experienced negative changes to health, safety, or welfare from experiencing further deterioration.
- Priority Need C: Self-Sufficiency and Stability (25%) Services focused on helping adult individuals
 and/or families work toward needed no assistance to satisfy their health, safety, and welfare; or services
 focused on helping adult individuals and/or families work towards a stable level of assistance needed on
 an ongoing basis.

NOTE: Public Service Grants' funding is solely for the use of the MVPN categories. Funds can move between categories based on availability and need.

The *Ordinance Code* requires the Council's action on MVPN on or before May 1 of each year. Thus, an emergency is necessary to meet the requirement.
