AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$2,260,000.00 PREVIOUSLY APPROPRIATED MATCHING GRANT FUNDS BY REALLOCATING \$1,410,000.00 APPROPRIATED IN ORDINANCE 2020-504-E FOR THREE UNSUCCESSFUL 2020 FLORIDA INLAND NAVIGATION DISTRICT ("FIND") GRANT PROJECT APPLICATIONS TO FULLY FUND CONSTRUCTION OF THE JACKSONVILLE ZOO DOCK AND REALLOCATING \$850,000.00 PROJECT UNEXPENDED MATCHING GRANT FUNDS APPROPRIATED IN ORDINANCE 2019-504-E FOR TWO 2019 FIND GRANT CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS THAT WILL COMPLETED UNDER BUDGET TO FULLY CONSTRUCTION OF THE RIVERFRONT PARK FISHING PLATFORM PROJECT, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 21-061; PURPOSE OF APPROPRIATION; AMENDING THE 2021-2025 FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT APPROVED BY ORDINANCE 2020-505-E TO FULLY FUND CONSTRUCTION OF THE JACKSONVILLE ZOO DOCK AND THE RIVERFRONT PARK FISHING PLATFORM PROJECTS; PROVIDING FOR CITY OVERSIGHT BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKS, RECREATION AND COMMUNITY SERVICES; REPORTING REQUIREMENTS; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on an annual basis the Florida Inland Navigation District solicits grant applications from counties within its jurisdiction to award grant funding to offset a portion of the

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related projects; and

design, construction, and acquisition costs for various waterways-

WHEREAS, applicants who are awarded FIND grant funding must agree to pay all internal project management fees imposed for a particular project, in addition to splitting project development costs with FIND by providing matching grant funds equivalent to 50% of the estimated design or construction costs and 75% of the estimated project acquisition costs for each project, as applicable, for each project receiving grant funding; and

WHEREAS, in 2019 the City applied for and was awarded FIND grant funding in the total amount of \$1,175,000.00 for construction of the Mandarin Park Dock and Kayak Launch and Oak Harbor Boat Ramp Dredge projects and pursuant to Ordinance 2019-504-E (as reflected in Schedule Blc to that Ordinance), the City appropriated \$1,410,000.00 (the "FY 2019-2020 Funds") to meet its cost-sharing obligations under the 2019 FIND grant awards; and

WHEREAS, both 2019 FIND grant projects were recently advertised for construction and the accepted bids are under budget, leaving approximately \$850,000.00 in FY 2019-2020 Funds available for reallocation to other projects; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to reallocate the FY 2019-2020 Funds to fully fund construction of the Riverfront Park Fishing Platform project, which is currently the City's second highest priority waterway project; and

2020 the City submitted four FIND WHEREAS, in grant receive funding for construction applications to the Dock, Riverfront Park Fishing Platform, Jacksonville Zoo Maxwell Boat Ramp Dredge and Goodbys Creek Dredge projects but was only awarded funding for the Bert Maxwell Boat Ramp Dredge project; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance 2020-504-E (as reflected in

Schedule B1c to that Ordinance), the City appropriated \$1,410,000.00 (the "FY 2020-2021 Funds") to cover the City's cost-sharing obligations for the three projects that failed to receive 2020 FIND grant funding; and

WHEREAS, the FY 2020-2021 Funds remain available to be reallocated to other projects; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to reallocate the FY 2020-2021 Funds to fully fund construction of the Jacksonville Zoo Dock project, which is the City's highest priority waterway project; and

WHEREAS, reallocation of the FY 2019-2020 Funds and the FY 2020-2021 Funds as described in this Ordinance is necessary to avoid further delay of the City's highest priority waterway projects and to avoid forfeiture of design phase grant reimbursements from FIND for both projects; now, therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Recitals. The recitals above are true and correct and are incorporated herein by reference.

Section 2. Appropriation. For the 2020-2021 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated sum from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

 - The funding above is an appropriation of \$2,260,000.00 for construction of the Jacksonville Zoo Dock and Riverfront Park Fishing Platform projects (collectively,

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the "Projects"), including a reallocation \$1,410,000.00 previously appropriated in Ordinance 2020-504-E as matching grant funds for three unsuccessful 2020 FIND grant project applications, and reallocation of \$850,000.00 in unexpended matching grant funds previously appropriated in Ordinance 2019-504-E for two 2019 FIND grant construction projects that will be completed under budget.

Section 3. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to reallocate unexpended matching grant funds from 2020 FIND several 2019 and grant projects to fully construction of the Projects. This appropriation includes a reallocation of \$1,410,000.00 previously appropriated in Ordinance 2020-504-E as contingency matching grant dollars for construction of the Riverfront Park Fishing Platform, Jacksonville Zoo Dock, and Goodbys Creek Dredge projects that ultimately did not receive 2020 FIND grant funding. These funds remain unexpended and will be used to fully fund construction of the Jacksonville Zoo Dock project. In addition, \$850,000.00 previously appropriated by Ordinance 2019-504-E as matching grant funds for the 2019 FIND grant Oak Harbor Ramp Dredge and Mandarin Park Dock and Kayak Launch construction projects will be reallocated to fully fund construction of the Riverfront Park Fishing Platform project.

The Jacksonville Zoo Dock and Riverfront Park Fishing Platform previously awarded grant were FIND funding reimbursement of 50% of the design costs for each project. Reimbursement of these design costs is contingent upon completion of construction of both Projects by the deadlines established in Reallocation of the FY 2019-2020 Funds and the FY each grant. 2020-2021 Funds as provided herein is necessary to ensure the City meets the grant deadlines to receive reimbursement of the design

costs for the Projects.

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Section 4. Capital Improvement Plan Amendment. Ordinance 2020-505-E, adopting the 2021-2025 Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan (the "CIP") for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to provide funding for the Projects, as more fully described in the Project Information Sheets, attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference. City Council finds that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next annual budget and CIP review will be detrimental to the best interests of the community because such deferral will result in unnecessary delay of the Projects and the potential for loss of FIND grant funding previously awarded for design of the Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, Projects. enactment of this Ordinance requires the affirmative vote of twothirds of the City Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP amendment set forth in this section. This Ordinance shall constitute an amendment to Ordinance 2020-505-E. In all other respects, the Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan approved by Ordinance 2020-505-E shall remain unchanged and continue in full force and effect.

Section 5. Oversight Department. The Department of Parks, Recreation and Community Services shall oversee the grants and Projects described herein.

Section 6. Reporting Requirements. The Department of Parks, Recreation and Community Services shall continue to provide quarterly status reports on all active FIND grants to the City's Waterways Commission.

Section 7. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
