ORDINANCE 2021-212

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING AND ADOPTING A NEW PILOT PROGRAM ENTITLED "MILITARY AND VETERANS' APPRECIATION PROGRAM" FOR REDUCED ADMISSION AT CERTAIN PARKS; PROVIDING FOR CITY OVERSIGHT BY THE PARKS, RECREATION AND COMMUNITY SERVICES DEPARTMENT; PROVIDING FOR A SUNSETTING OF THE PROGRAM UNLESS EXTENDED BY LEGISLATION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Jacksonville ("City") recognizes the strong presence of active military service members and veterans living in Jacksonville and the surrounding communities; and

WHEREAS, the City acknowledges the many sacrifices made by active military service members and veterans and seeks to ensure the continued economic wellness, employment, veteran quality of life and availability of benefits to active military service members and veterans in Jacksonville; and

23 WHEREAS, as an added benefit to active military service 24 members and veterans, the City desires to begin a pilot program for 25 one year, which would reduce the park admission fees for active 26 service members and veterans by ½ for admission to Kathryn Abbey 27 Hanna Park and Huguenot Memorial Park; and

28 WHEREAS, if the pilot program is successful, the City will 29 consider making such fee reductions applicable permanently; now 30 therefore

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BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Approval and Adoption of the "Military and 1 Section 1. 2 Veterans' Appreciation Program." There is hereby approved and adopted within the City a "Military and Veterans' Appreciation 3 Program" which will allow for active military service members and 4 5 veterans, regardless of residency in Jacksonville, to receive a reduction of ½ of the daily admission fees charged at Kathryn Abbey 6 7 Hanna Park and Huguenot Memorial Park (which may be applied to car, pedestrian and biker admission but not on annual passes). In order 8 9 to qualify for the reduced admission fees, the active military 10 service member or veteran must produce at the park entrance at the time of admission a state issued military ID or a DD214 ID. The 11 "Military and Veterans' Appreciation Program" will initially run as 12 a pilot program for a period of one year beginning on June 1, 2021 13 and ending on May 31, 2022. The Parks, Recreation and Community 14 15 Services Department is tasked with tracking the number of active military service members and veterans which participate in the 16 17 "Military and Veterans' Appreciation Program" and receive the reduced admission fees, tabulating the totals broken down further 18 by park and by participant type (active service vs. veterans and 19 20 car, pedestrian or biker), and the cost of the Program, and shall 21 submit a preliminary report to the Council on or before December 22 31, 2021 and a final report to Council by June 15, 2022. The Parks, 23 Recreation and Community Services Department shall also include in 24 its final report any recommendations regarding the pilot program, 25 including whether it is recommended that the program should be made 26 permanent and whether any modifications to the program are 27 suggested.

28 Section 2. Oversight Department. The Parks, Recreation, 29 and Community Services Department shall oversee the Program as 30 described herein.

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Section 3. Sunset. The provisions of this Ordinance

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1 providing for a pilot program for "Military and Veterans' 2 Appreciation Program" as described in Section 1, shall sunset, be 3 repealed, and be of no further effect on May 31, 2022, unless 4 extended in subsequent legislation.

5 Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become 6 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 7 without the Mayor's signature.
