RESOLUTION 2021-218

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE CITY COUNCIL'S STRONG CONDEMNATION OF THE RECENT OUTBREAK IN OUR COUNTRY OF HARRASSMENT, ATTACKS AND HATE CRIMES DIRECTED AT ASIAN-AMERICANS AND PACIFIC ISLANDERS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Asian-Americans and Pacific Islanders make up a substantial and growing proportion of the American population, and comprise 5.6% of the United States' population, 3.35% of Florida's population and 4.7% of Jacksonville's citizens by recent estimates; and

WHEREAS, Asian-Americans are the fastest growing segment of eligible voters in the United States, growing by 139% between 2000 and 2020 to 4.7% of the American voting age population; and

19 WHEREAS, Asian-Americans are well-represented in every field 20 of endeavor in the United States, from education to business to the 21 arts to the sciences to social services, and are productive and 22 law-abiding citizens and tremendous contributors to our 23 communities; and

WHEREAS, in recent months an ugly tide of anti-Asian incidents has been reported our country, including verbal and physical threats and actual violence directed at Asian-Americans, and this disturbing trend cannot go unchallenged by their fellow citizens who believe in equality and justice; and

29 WHEREAS, on April 12, 2021, the Jacksonville Chinese 30 Association along with at least 11 additional groups representing 31 racial minority groups and interests in Jacksonville organized a Rally Against Asian Hate at Memorial Park to draw attention to this
serious challenge to America's ideals; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The Jacksonville City Council 4 strongly 5 condemns the recent outbreak of anti-Asian harassment, threats and violence that has been reported in cities around the country and 6 7 expresses its solidarity with and support of the city's Asian-American and Pacific Islander citizens. The City Council urges all 8 9 citizens to be informed and active advocates for the cause of 10 justice and of fair and equal treatment for all people, regardless of their heritage. 11

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
