The family members acquired the property in two phases in 1973 and 1981 and previously used it to camp during the winter. Two parcels were significantly submerged by the construction of the adjacent Heckscher Drive bridge and all five lots are currently classified as waste land/saltwater marsh by the Property Appraiser Office. The family members would like to donate this property to the City so they can close out their corporate entity. In recent years, the property has been used informally by local citizens for fishing and launching kayaks. Once it becomes a park, these recreational uses can be formalized with some modest enhancements to the site. The donation is contingent on the park being named Thebaut Sisters Landing. Title Certifications and Phase 1 Environmental Assessment has been conducted on these parcels with no significant issues identified.




