## RESOLUTION 2021-268-A

A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMEMORATING THE  $100^{\text{TH}}$  ANNIVERSARY OF BOY SCOUTING IN NORTHEAST FLORIDA; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Boy Scouts of America was incorporated on February 8, 1910, under the laws of the District of Columbia by William D. Boyce, after he learned of the Scouting movement during a visit to London, and on June 21, 1910, thirty-four national representatives of various boys' work agencies met to establish the organization; and

WHEREAS, on February 17, 1911, 14 local boys founded the first Boy Scout troop in Jacksonville, which would grow over the course of a decade to 10 troops, 200 participants, and a local governing body - the Jacksonville Council - later renamed the North Florida Council; and

WHEREAS, Boy Scouts of America has grown into one of the largest youth organizations in America, with about 110 million participants over the course of its first century, and prior to the COVID pandemic the North Florida Council had 13,000 active members in its 17-county region; and

WHEREAS, since its inception, Boy Scouts of America has endeavored to prepare young people to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetimes by instilling in them the important values of the Scout Oath, including duty to God and country, helping others at all times, and keeping physically strong, mentally awake, and morally straight, and the Scout Law is that a Scout is trustworthy, loyal,
