AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$5,000 FROM PRIVATE DONATIONS TO THEJUMP START PROGRAM ADMINISTERED BY NEFLORIDA SOBER LIVING ALLIANCE, INC. WITHIN THE OPIOID ABUSE PROGRAM TRUST FUND; APPROVING, AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER, AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE FLORIDA SOBER LIVING ALLIANCE, INC.; WAIVING PROVISIONS IN SECTION 118.201(F) (RELEASE OF APPROPRIATIONS), ORDINANCE CODE, IN ORDER TO ALLOW FOR ADVANCE PAYMENT OF 25% AND TO ALLOW FOR THE FINAL REPORT TO BE SUBMITTED WITH THE LAST PAYMENT REQUEST; INVOKING THE EXCEPTION SECTION 126.107(G), ORDINANCE CODE, ALLOW DIRECT CONTRACT WITH NE FLORIDA SOBER LIVING ALLIANCE, INC. TO PROVIDE THE SERVICES FOR THE JUMP START PROGRAM; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE OFFICE OF GRANTS AND CONTRACT COMPLIANCE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2020-2021 fiscal year,

- (c) Explanation of Appropriation The funding above is being appropriated from private donations to the Jump Start Program administered by NE Florida Sober Living Alliance, Inc. within the Opioid Abuse Program Trust Fund to be utilized for the Jump Start program.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funding for the Jump Start program, as more fully described in Exhibit 2 attached hereto. The Jump Start program administered by NE Florida Sober Living Alliance, Inc. will utilize this funding as a stopgap measure to provide daily living assistance to individuals suffering from opioid dependence or addiction with daily housing vouchers. The cost per voucher is \$27 and these funds are estimated to assist 37 individuals.

Section 3. Agreement approved and execution authorized. There is hereby approved, and the Mayor, or his designee, and Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, the Funding Agreement between the City of Jacksonville and NE Florida Sober Living Alliance, Inc., in substantially the form as attached hereto as Revised Exhibit 3, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 3, Revised Agmt, May 3, 2021 - NCSPHS", and incorporated herein by this reference (the "Agreement"). The Agreement may include such additions, deletions and changes as may be reasonable, necessary

and incidental for carrying out the purposes thereof, as may be acceptable to the Mayor, or his designee, with such inclusion and acceptance being evidenced by execution of the Agreement by the Mayor, or his designee; provided however, no modification to the Agreement may increase the financial obligations or liability of the City to an amount in excess of the amount stated in the Agreement or decrease the duties and obligations of NE Florida Sober Living Alliance, Inc., and any such modification shall be technical only and shall be subject to appropriate legal review and approval by the Office of General Counsel. For the purposes of this Ordinance, the term "technical changes" is defined as those changes having no financial impact to the City and any other non-substantive changes that do not substantively increase the duties and responsibilities of the City under the provisions of the Agreement.

Section 4. Waiver of the provisions in Section 118.201(f) (Release of appropriations), Ordinance Code. The City hereby waives the provisions of Section 118.201(f) (Release of appropriations), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code. The waiver of Section 118.201(f), Ordinance Code, is needed in order to allow for advance payment of 25% which is in excess of the of 10% allowed by Section 118.201, Ordinance Code, and to allow for the final report to be submitted with the last payment request instead of November 15, 2021 as required by Code.

Section 5. Invoking the exception to Section 126.107(g), Ordinance Code. The City is hereby authorized to procure the use of the professional services of NE Florida Sober Living Alliance, Inc., to provide services for the Jump Start program. Pursuant to Section 126.107(g) (Exemptions), Part 1 (General Regulations), Chapter 126 (Procurement Code), Ordinance Code, such procurement is exempted from competitive solicitation because the supplies or
