29 who believe in equality and justice; and

30WHEREAS, on April 12, 2021, the Jacksonville Chinese31Association along with at least 11 additional groups representing

racial minority groups and interests in Jacksonville organized a
Rally Against Asian Hate at Memorial Park to draw attention to this
serious challenge to America's ideals; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council 5 Jacksonville strongly condemns the recent outbreak of anti-Asian harassment, threats and 6 7 violence that has been reported in cities around the country and expresses its solidarity with and support of the city's Asian-8 9 American and Pacific Islander citizens. The City Council urges all 10 citizens to be informed and active advocates for the cause of justice and of fair and equal treatment for all people, regardless 11 of their heritage. 12

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
