AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$133,800 FROM THE SOCIAL JUSTICE AND COMMUNITY INVESTMENT SPECIAL COMMITTEE CONTINGENCY FOR THE MENTAL HEALTH OFFENDER PROGRAM ("MHOP"); APPROVING, AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE DELIVER, A FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE AND THE I.M. SULZBACHER CENTER FOR THE HOMELESS, ("SULZBACHER CENTER"); INVOKING THE EXCEPTION SECTION 126.107(G), ORDINANCE CODE, ALLOW DIRECT CONTRACT WITH I.M. SULZBACHER THE HOMELESS, INC. TO PROVIDE CENTER FOR SERVICES TO THE MHOP AND MANAGE THE MHOP; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE OFFICE GRANTS AND CONTRACT COMPLIANCE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2020-2021 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

Explanation of Appropriation - The funding above is being (C) appropriated from the Social Justice and Community Investment Special Committee Contingency to provide additional funding for the Mental Health Offender Program, a jail diversion program for mentally ill misdemeanor offenders, and additional wrap services, including Housing, transportation, communication needs of the MHOP participants managed by the Sulzbacher Center.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide additional funding for the Mental Health Offender Program (MHOP), which is a jail diversion program for mentally ill misdemeanor offenders, services and a program coordinator, as more fully described in Exhibit 2 attached hereto. The MHOP operational services is managed by the Sulzbacher Center.

Section 3. Agreement approved and execution authorized. There is hereby approved, and the Mayor, or his designee, and Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, the First Amendment to the Funding Agreement between the City of Jacksonville and the I.M. Sulzbacher Center for the Homeless, Inc., in substantially the form as attached hereto as Exhibit 3, and incorporated herein by this reference (the "Agreement"). Agreement may include such additions, deletions and changes as may be reasonable, necessary and incidental for carrying out purposes thereof, as may be acceptable to the Mayor, or designee, with such inclusion and acceptance being evidenced by execution of the Agreement by the Mayor, or his designee; provided however, no modification to the Agreement may increase

financial obligations or liability of the City to an amount in excess of the amount stated in the Agreement or decrease the duties and obligations of the Sulzbacher Center as stated in the Agreement, and any such modification shall be technical only and shall be subject to appropriate legal review and approval by the Office of General Counsel. For the purposes of this Ordinance, the term "technical changes" is defined as those changes having no financial impact to the City and any other non-substantive changes that do not substantively increase the duties and responsibilities of the City under the provisions of the Agreement.

Section 4. Invoking the exception to Section 126.107(g), Ordinance Code. The City is hereby authorized to procure the use of the professional services of the Sulzbacher Center, to provide additional services to the MHOP program, a jail diversion program for mentally ill misdemeanor offenders. Pursuant to Section 126.107(g) (Exemptions), Part 1 (General Regulations), Chapter 126 (Procurement Code), Ordinance Code, such procurement is exempted from competitive solicitation because the supplies or services are to be provided by those specifically prescribed within authorizing legislation that appropriates the same. With the exception of the foregoing, all other provisions of Chapter 126, Ordinance Code, shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 5. Oversight. The Mayor is requested to appoint the Office of Grants and Contract Compliance to oversee the project in Section 2 above and to ensure compliance with all other appropriate laws.

Section 6. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
