AN ORDINANCE MAKING CERTAIN FINDINGS AND APPROPRIATING \$19,900,000.00 IN CORONAVIRUS AID, RELIEF, AND ECONOMIC SECURITY ("CARES") ACT FUNDING, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 21-082; AUTHORIZING DISBURSEMENT OF \$16,833,586.69 TO FUNDING TO OFFSET PROVIDE OVERTIME AND PAYROLL-RELATED EXPENSES INCURRED JACKSONVILLE SHERIFF'S OFFICE ("JSO") AND THE JACKSONVILLE FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT ("JFRD") SINCE MARCH 2020 AS A DIRECT RESULT OF COVID-19, \$488,016.67 TO PROCURE EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER/JFRD EMERGENCY RESPONSE SYSTEMS AND EQUIPMENT UPGRADES, \$250,000.00 TO THE STATE OF FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, DUVAL COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT ("DOH") FOR VACCINATIONS AND VARIOUS OTHER HEALTH RELATED SERVICES ΙN RESPONSE TO COVID-19, \$1,000,000.00 IN BUSINESS RELIEF GRANT FUNDS TO THE JACKSONVILLE SYMPHONY ASSOCIATION, INC. COVER ECONOMIC LOSSES FROM CONTINUED BUSINESS INTERRUPTION DUE TO COVID-19, \$50,000.00 IN BUSINESS RELIEF GRANT FUNDS TO CATHEDRAL DISTRICT-JAX, INC. TO COVER ECONOMIC LOSSES FROM BUSINESS INTERRUPTION DUE TO COVID-19, AND \$1,278,396.64 TO BE ALLOCATED BY THECITY COUNCIL FOR OTHER CARES QUALIFYING EXPENDITURES; PURPOSE OF

APPROPRIATION; PROVIDING A CARRYOVER OF FUNDS FROM YEAR TO YEAR UNTIL SUCH FUNDS ARE EXPENDED OR LAPSE, AND PROVIDING THAT ANY CARES ACT GRANT FUNDING NOT EXPENDED PURSUANT TO THIS ORDINANCE BY NOVEMBER 30, 2021 SHALL REVERT TO THE FUND OF ORIGIN FOR REAPPROPRIATION FOR AUTHORIZED EXPENDITURES UNDER THE TERMS OF THE CARES ACT GRANT; APPROVING, AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER AN AGREEMENT WITH THE STATE OF FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, DUVAL COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT FOR THE PROVISION OF VACCINATIONS AND VARIOUS OTHER HEALTH RELATED SERVICES IN RESPONSE TO COVID-19; INVOKING THE EXCEPTION OF SECTION 126.107(G) (EXEMPTIONS), PART 1 (GENERAL REGULATIONS), CHAPTER 126 (PROCUREMENT CODE), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ALLOW FOR A DIRECT CONTRACT WITH THE STATE OF FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, DUVAL COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT; APPROVING, AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY TO ENTER INTO, A COVID-19 BUSINESS GRANT AGREEMENT WITH JACKSONVILLE SYMPHONY ASSOCIATION, INC.; APPROVING, AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY TO ENTER INTO, A COVID-19 BUSINESS GRANT AGREEMENT WITH CATHEDRAL DISTRICT-JAX, INC.; INVOKING THE EXCEPTION OF 126.107(G) (EXEMPTIONS), CHAPTER 126 (PROCUREMENT CODE), ORDINANCE CODE, TO DIRECT CONTRACT WITH JACKSONVILLE SYMPHONY ASSOCIATION, INC. AND CATHEDRAL DISTRICT-JAX, INC.; AUTHORIZING THE

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CITY TO ENTER INTO AMENDMENTS TO EXISTING AGREEMENTS WITH CARES ACT FUNDING RECIPIENTS AS NECESSARY TO REAPPROPRIATE CARES ACT GRANT FORTH HEREIN; FUNDS AS SET PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION PROVIDING FOR DEPARTMENT; COMPLIANCE WITH ACT APPLICABLE CARES GRANT FUNDING REOUIREMENTS; REOUESTING ONE CYCLE EMERGENCY PASSAGE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinances 2020-235-E and 2020-378-E, the City appropriated approximately \$167,120,861.00 of CARES Act grant funding from the U.S. Department of Treasury to fund various grants and other programs designed to provide economic relief and assistance to individuals and businesses throughout Duval County, Florida; and

WHEREAS, recognizing the CARES Act, as subsequently amended by the Consolidated Appropriations Act (2021), requires that all eligible costs be incurred on or before December 31, 2021, the City desires to appropriate and authorize disbursement of \$19,900,000.00 in unexpended CARES Act grant funds previously appropriated to various grant and relief programs established by the City to provide funding for other eligible expenses as more fully set forth herein; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Findings. It is hereby ascertained, determined, found and declared as follows:

- (a) The recitals set forth herein are true and correct.
- (b) The grants and actions authorized hereby will provide economic relief to individuals and businesses located in Duval County, Florida, thus benefitting the health, safety and welfare of

the citizens of Duval County.

- (c) The provision of the City's assistance as set forth herein is necessary and appropriate, and the City's assistance is reasonable and not excessive, taking into account the extent of the public benefits expected to be derived from the grants and other relief authorized hereby, and taking into account all other forms of assistance available.
- (d) The authorizations provided by this Ordinance are for public uses and purposes for which the City may use its powers as a county, municipality and as a political subdivision of the State of Florida and may expend public funds, and the necessity in the public interest for the provisions herein enacted is hereby declared as a matter of legislative determination.
- (e) This Ordinance is adopted pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 163, 166 and 125, Florida Statutes, as amended, the City's Charter, and other applicable provisions of law.
- Section 2. Appropriation. For the 2020-2021 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding appropriated above is a transfer of \$19,900,000.00 of unexpended Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act grant funds as follows: (1) \$12,500,000.00 from the City's COVID-19 Federal Emergency

Management Agency ("FEMA") non-reimbursable expenses contingency fund, (2) \$4,600,000.00 from the VyStar COVID-19 Small Business Relief and Employee Retention Grant Program created by Ordinance 2020-201-E, and (3) \$2,800,000.00 from the Eviction and Foreclosure Prevention Program created by Ordinance 2020-673-E. re-allocation of funds will be used to offset the costs for JSO and JFRD overtime and payroll-related expenses incurred since March 2020 as a direct result of COVID-19, procurement of Emergency Operations fund the Center/JFRD emergency response systems and equipment upgrades, to provide for vaccinations and various other health-related services from the DOH in response and to provide financial COVID-19, assistance individuals and businesses suffering from the continued economic impact of COVID-19.

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Section 3. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 2 is to reappropriate CARES Act grant funding to provide: (1) \$16,833,586.69 to offset overtime and payroll-related expenses incurred by JSO and JFRD since March 2020 as a direct result of COVID-19; \$488,016.67 to procure emergency (2) operations center/JFRD emergency response systems and equipment upgrades; (3) \$250,000.00 to the DOH for the provision of vaccinations various other health related services in response to COVID-19; (4) \$1,000,000.00 in business relief grant funds to Jacksonville Symphony Association, Inc. to cover economic losses from continued business interruption due to COVID-19; (5) \$50,000.00 in business relief grant funds to Cathedral District-Jax, Inc. to cover economic losses from business interruption due to COVID-19; and (6) \$1,278,396.64 to be allocated by the City Council for other CARES Act qualifying expenditures.

Section 4. Carryover. The funds appropriated herein shall not lapse but shall carryover as appropriated from year to year until such funds are expended or lapse according to the terms of the CARES Act. Funds appropriated in this Ordinance must be disbursed before November 30, 2021. Failure to do so will cause said funds to revert to accounts of origin for reappropriation for authorized expenditures under the terms of the CARES Act, subject to future Council approval.

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Authorization Section 5. Approval and to Execute an Agreement Between the City and the State of Florida Department of Health, Duval County Health Department ("DOH"). The Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver on behalf of the City an agreement with the State of Florida Department of Health, Duval County Health Department, in an amount not-to-exceed \$250,000.00, subject to the Scope of Services more particularly described in **Exhibit** attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, and all other contracts and documents, including extensions, renewals and amendments to the agreement, and otherwise take all action necessary to effectuate the intent of this Ordinance, subject to appropriate legal review and approval by the Office of General Counsel and the City's Risk Management Division for appropriate insurance and indemnification requirements in accordance with Section 128.601, Ordinance Code.

Section 6. Invoking the Exception to Section 126.107(g), Ordinance Code. The City is hereby authorized to directly procure the use of the professional services of the DOH for the provision of vaccinations and various other health related services in response to COVID-19. Pursuant to Section 126.107(g) (Exemptions), Part 1 (General Regulations), Chapter 126 (Procurement Code), Ordinance Code, such procurement is exempted from competitive

solicitation because the supplies or services are to be provided by those specifically prescribed within authorizing legislation that appropriates the same. With the exception of the foregoing, all other provisions of Chapter 126, Ordinance Code, shall remain in full force and effect. The Scope of Services more particularly described in Exhibit 2 designates the specific services to be performed by the DOH as a subrecipient of the City. The Scope of Services may include such additions, deletions and changes as may be reasonable, necessary and incidental for carrying out purposes thereof, as may be acceptable to the Mayor, or his designee; provided however, such modifications shall be technical only, subject to appropriate legal review and approval by the Office of General Counsel, and shall be undertaken in compliance with any applicable requirements of the CARES Act, consistent with the intent of this Ordinance. For the purposes of this Ordinance, the term "technical changes" is defined as those having no financial impact to the City and any other non-substantive changes. The failure of the DOH to enter into the applicable agreement with the City shall render the DOH ineligible to receive the grant funds authorized hereby.

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Approval and Authorization to Execute a COVID-Section 7. 19 Business Grant Agreement Between the City and Jacksonville Symphony Association, Inc. ("Symphony"). There is hereby approved, and the Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute a COVID-19 Business Grant Agreement with Jacksonville Symphony Association, Inc. in a not-to-exceed \$1,000,000.00 "Symphony of (the Agreement"), substantially the same form as is attached hereto as Exhibit 3 and incorporated herein by this reference, to be used to offset business interruption expenses and economic losses of Symphony due to COVID-19, subject to the terms and restrictions of the CARES

Act. The Symphony Agreement may include such additions, deletions and changes as may be reasonable, necessary and incidental for carrying out the purposes set forth in this Ordinance, as may be acceptable to the Mayor, or his designee, with such inclusion and acceptance being evidenced by execution of the Agreement by the Mayor, or his designee; provided however, such modifications shall be technical only, subject to appropriate legal review and approval by the Office of General Counsel, and shall be undertaken in compliance with any applicable requirements of the CARES Act, consistent with the intent of this Ordinance. For the purposes of this Ordinance, the term "technical changes" is defined as those having no financial impact to the City and any other non-substantive changes.

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Approval and Authorization to Execute a COVID-Section 8. Business Grant Agreement Between the City and Cathedral District-Jax, Inc. ("Cathedral"). There is hereby approved, and the Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute a COVID-19 Business Grant Agreement with Cathedral, in substantially the same form as is attached hereto as Exhibit 4 and incorporated herein by this reference (the "Cathedral Agreement"), in a not-to-exceed amount of \$50,000.00, to be used to offset business interruption expenses and economic losses of Cathedral due to COVID-19, subject to the terms and restrictions of the CARES Act. The Cathedral Agreement may include such additions, deletions and changes as may be reasonable, necessary and incidental for carrying out the purposes set forth in this Ordinance, as may be acceptable to the Mayor, or his designee, with such inclusion and acceptance being evidenced by execution of the Agreement by the Mayor, or his designee; provided however, such modifications shall be technical only, subject to appropriate legal review and approval by the Office of General Counsel, and shall be

undertaken in compliance with any applicable requirements of the CARES Act, consistent with the intent of this Ordinance. For the purposes of this Ordinance, the term "technical changes" is defined as those having no financial impact to the City and any other non-substantive changes.

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Section 9. Invoking the Exception to Section 126.107(g), Ordinance Code. The City is hereby authorized to enter into direct agreements, as authorized herein, with the Jacksonville Symphony Association, Inc. and Cathedral District-Jax, Inc. for the purposes of providing COVID-19 relief and assistance as more fully set forth Section 126.107(g) (Exemptions), Part Pursuant to (General Regulations), Chapter 126 (Procurement Code), Ordinance Code, such procurement is exempted from competitive solicitation because the supplies or services are to be provided by those specifically prescribed within authorizing legislation appropriates the same. With the exception of the foregoing, all other provisions of Chapter 126, Ordinance Code, shall remain in full force and effect. The failure of any entity identified herein to enter into the applicable agreement with the City shall render such entity ineligible to receive the grant funds authorized hereby.

Execution Authorized. There is hereby approved, and the Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver any and all amendments to existing agreements with various recipients of CARES Act funding from the City to withdraw any funds not already incurred and/or to reduce the maximum indebtedness of the City as necessary to reappropriate said CARES Act funds to various subrecipients, programs and other relief efforts as more fully set forth herein.

Section 11. Oversight Department. The Finance and

Administration Department shall provide oversight for all contracts, contract amendments, and expenditures authorized hereunder.

Funding Requirements. The State of Florida Department of Health, Duval County Health Department, Jacksonville Symphony Association, Inc., and Cathedral District-Jax, Inc. shall comply with all applicable CARES Act grant requirements in their respective management and use of the CARES Act funds provided pursuant to this Ordinance, including but not limited to, the audit requirements attached hereto as Exhibit 5.

Pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. One cycle emergency passage of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that the CARES Act requires that all eligible costs and expenses be incurred on or before December 31, 2021.

Section 14. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
