STOCKTON ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, IN COUNCIL DISTRICT FINDING A MUNICIPAL PURPOSE; WAIVING REQUIREMENT OF SECTION 106.315 (DISTRICT COUNCIL EXPENDITURES), ORDINANCE CODE, FUNDS BE USED ON CITY PROPERTY; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER AN AMENDMENT TO THE JOINT USE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE AND THE SCHOOL BOARD OF DUVAL COUNTY; OVERSIGHT BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS; INVOKING THE EXCEPTION IN SECTION 126.107(G), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ALLOW DIRECT CONTRACT WITH JAX UTILITIES MANAGEMENT, INC., TO INSTALL THE RELOCATED SIDEWALK; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2020-2021 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the

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indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

Explanation of Appropriation: Appropriating \$14,247.75 (C) from District 14-Autumn Bond Funding to fund construction of a sidewalk at John Stockton Elementary along Carlisle Road.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide \$14,247.75 of funding for the installation of a relocated public sidewalk on property owned by the Duval County School Board along Carlisle Road, as more fully described in Exhibit 2, attached hereto.

Section 3. Finding of Public Purpose. The City finds that the installation of a new, relocated sidewalk on Duval County School Board property, for use by students and personnel of the John N.C. Stockton Elementary School, the surrounding community, and the public at-large, is a valid municipal purpose for which funds should be expended.

Section 4. Waiving provisions of Section 106.315 (District Council expenditures), Ordinance Code, as to use of funds on City Property. The provisions of Section 106.315, Ordinance Code, requiring that bond funds be used on City property, is hereby waived. The existing public sidewalk on Carlisle Road is located on property owned by the Duval County School Board; to address a public safety concern made by the John N.C. Stockton Elementary School, the City will pay the costs to relocate the existing sidewalk on Duval County School Board property and the Duval County School Board will thereafter maintain the sidewalk. The relocated sidewalk will remain open to the public.

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Agreement. The Mayor, or his designee, and Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver an amendment to the Joint Use Agreement between the City of Jacksonville and the School Board of Duval County, to add the relocated sidewalk along Carlisle Road at John N.C. Stockton Elementary School to the scope of the agreement with the School Board agreeing to maintain the sidewalk thereafter.

Section 6. Oversight Department. The Department of Public Works shall oversee the project described herein.

Section 7. Invoking the exception to Section 126.107(g), Ordinance Code. The City is hereby authorized to procure the use of the professional services of Jax Utilities Management, Inc. to install the sidewalk specified in **Exhibit 2**. Jax Utilities Management, Inc. is an existing city contractor and has provided such services prior. Pursuant to Section 126.107(q) (Exemptions), Part 1 (General Regulations), Chapter 126 (Procurement Code), Ordinance Code, such procurement is exempted from competitive solicitation because the supplies or services are to be provided by those specifically prescribed within authorizing legislation that appropriates the same. With the exception of the foregoing, all other provisions of Chapter 126, Ordinance Code, shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 8. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become

effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
