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ORDINANCE 2021-255-E

AN ORDINANCE RENAMING "CHUCK ROGERS PARK", LOCATED AΤ 11950 SAN JOSE BOULEVARD, 32223, IN DISTRICT 6, AS JACKSONVILLE, FL "ROGERS PARK" TO RECOGNIZE THE MANY ACCOMPLISHMENTS AND SERVICE TO YOUTH SPORTS OF CHUCK ROGERS AND HIS SON, CORKY AMENDING SECTION 122.105 (PUBLIC BUILDINGS, PUBLIC FACILITIES AND PUBLIC PARKS NAMING AND RENAMING PROCEDURES), CHAPTER 122 (PUBLIC PROPERTY), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ADDRESS RESPONSIBILITY FOR COSTS OF LEGAL NOTICES; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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WHEREAS, Chuck Rogers Park, located at 11950 San Jose Boulevard, in Council District 6, was named for Charles Buxton "Chuck" Rogers, III, who worked for the City's Parks and Recreation Department for 41 years; and

WHEREAS, Chuck Rogers started and ran the City's youth leagues in all sports, was the guiding light in the tremendous rise of slow-pitch softball in the City, served for many years as the grand marshal for the City's parades, and was inducted into the Jacksonville Sports Hall of Fame; and

WHEREAS, Charles Buxton "Corky" Rogers, IV, son of Chuck

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Rogers, was a three-sport athlete in high school, attended Georgia
Tech on a football scholarship and eventually returned to
Jacksonville where he began his storied career as a high school
football coach; and

WHEREAS, as head coach, Corky Rogers led his Lee High School football team to 10 consecutive district titles from 1977 to 1986, and when he left Lee High School after the 1988 season to coach the Bolles School football program, the Bolles Bulldogs went on to win 10 state championships under his leadership between 1989 and 2011; and

WHEREAS, Corky Rogers is recognized as the winningest coach in Florida high school football history and the fifth winningest coach in the nation and received multiple coaching accolades throughout his coaching career in Florida and nationally; and

WHEREAS, Corky Rogers passed away at the age of 76 on February 26, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Council desires to honor the legacy of Chuck and Corky Rogers and their dedication to youth sports programs in Jacksonville by renaming "Chuck Rogers Park" to be known as "Rogers Park" in order to recognize the contribution of both of these great men to Jacksonville's youth sports programs; and

WHEREAS, the provisions of Section 122.105, Ordinance Code, for renaming of the park have been met; the public hearings have been held and the Planning and Development Department has submitted its report to the Council; now, therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. "Chuck Rogers Park," located at 11950 San Jose Boulevard, Jacksonville, Florida 32223 in District 6, is hereby renamed "Rogers Park" in recognition of the many contributions to youth sports programs and to honor the legacy of Chuck Rogers and his son, Corky Rogers.

Section 2. Amending Section 122.105 (Public buildings, public facilities and public parks naming and renaming procedures), Ordinance Code. Section 122.105 (Public buildings, public facilities and public parks naming and renaming procedure), Chapter 122 (Public Property), Ordinance Code, is hereby amended to read as follows:

## CHAPTER 122. PUBLIC PROPERTY.

## PART 1. MUNICIPAL BUILDINGS AND OFFICES.

\* \* \*

Sec. 122.105. Public buildings, public facilities and public parks naming and renaming procedures.

\* \* \*

- (f) Public Hearings Required for all name changes for public buildings, public facilities, and public parks.
  - (1) Before final consideration of an ordinance changing a name of a public building, public facility, or public park the City shall hold three public hearings on the proposal.
  - (2) One public hearing shall be before the appropriate Committee of reference, which shall be held at least 30 days following introduction of the ordinance so that the Planning and Development Department Report will be available for consideration by the Committee of reference along with the legislation.
  - (3) Two public hearings shall be held before the Council. The first Council public hearing shall be scheduled for the Council meeting immediately after the Committee public hearing discussed in subsection (2) above. This public hearing will be in lieu of the public hearing ordinarily scheduled pursuant to Rule 3.601, Council Rules. The second Council public hearing and final action by Council shall be scheduled at least 45 days from the introduction

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of the ordinance so that the advisory recommendation from the Historic Preservation Commission is available for consideration.

(4) Responsibility for complying with the noticing and advertising provisions herein (and costs associated therewith) shall be borne by the Department initiating the naming or renaming request. For naming or renaming under this Section initiated by one or more Council Members, the Legislative Services Division shall be responsible for notice and advertising compliance.

Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
