RESOLUTION 2021-489

A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE CITY COUNCIL'S SOLIDARITY WITH THE PROTESTORS ACROSS FLORIDA AND IN CUBA ADVOCATING FOR INCREASED FREEDOM FOR THE CUBAN PEOPLE; REQUESTING EMERGENCY PASSAGE UPON INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, in the last two weeks the citizens of Cuba have taken to the streets, in numbers not seen in several decades, to protest against difficult economic conditions and the lack of freedom in their country; and

WHEREAS, in the last week those protests have sparked similar demonstrations and calls for Cuban economic and political reforms in several cities across Florida, including Miami, Orlando, Tampa and Jacksonville; and

WHEREAS, the protestors in Cuba and their supporters across Florida are expressing their discontent both with the economic conditions in Cuba - food and medicine shortages, high inflation, a stagnant economy, a collapsing health care system - and with the lack of freedom and the political repression of the country's Communist regime; and

WHEREAS, since the protests have been taking place, Cuba's repressive government has responded by arresting and detaining demonstrators, shooting at unarmed protestors, and shutting down internet service and social media platforms in an effort to stifle political dissent and opposition to the ruling Communist party's authoritarian policies; and

WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to express its support for the efforts of the protestors to bring about a more just and livable society free of the socialist agenda of the ruling Communist regime and its solidarity with people everywhere who fight for freedom and justice; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

The City Council expresses its solidarity with Section 1. the protestors, both in Cuba and around Florida, who are protesting against the Communist government of Cuba and extends its hope that their efforts will lead to positive changes that bring greater freedom and democracy to that island nation and its people.

Section 2. Requesting emergency passage upon introduction pursuant to Council Rule 4.901. Emergency passage upon introduction of this Resolution is requested in order to offer timely support to the on-going protests without delay.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
