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ORDINANCE 2021-570-E

AN ORDINANCE MAKING CERTAIN FINDINGS AND APPROPRIATING \$4,000,000 IN CORONAVIRUS RELIEF, FISCAL RECOVERY, AND CRITICAL CAPITAL PROJECTS FUNDS FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF TREASURY IN ACCORDANCE WITH \mathtt{THE} AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT OF 2021 (THE "ARP ACT") TO CONTINUED COVID-19 RESPONSE INCLUDING COVID-19 TESTING, VACCINATIONS, AND OTHER HEALTH-RELATED NEEDS AND SERVICES, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 21-112; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION DEPARTMENT; PROVIDING FOR CARRYOVER OF FUNDS THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30, 2022; REQUESTING EMERGENCY PASSAGE UPON INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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WHEREAS, the Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 ("COVID-19") was first discovered in the United States in January 2020 and since that time this severe, acute respiratory illness has infected over 32 million and killed over 610,000 Americans; and

WHEREAS, communities throughout the United States have recently experienced a rise in the number of COVID-19 cases due to

various factors, including the introduction of a new, highlycontagious variant of the Coronavirus; and

WHEREAS, the number of positive COVID-19 cases in Florida has surged significantly in the past several weeks, with the highest one-day totals occurring in Duval County over the last few days; and

WHEREAS, the City of Jacksonville recognizes that one of the most effective means of preventing the spread of COVID-19 is to make safe, readily-available testing opportunities and other health-related services available to its citizens so that individuals who test positive for COVID-19 can be identified and educated on appropriate precautions they can take to prevent further spread of the virus; and

WHEREAS, the United States federal government recognizes that state, territorial, tribal and local governments have been called on to respond to COVID-19 at an immense scale, including efforts to prevent and address spread of the disease in a manner that is tailored to meet the specific needs of each community; and

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2021, the American Rescue Plan Act (the "ARP Act") was signed into law and provided for the distribution of Coronavirus relief, fiscal recovery, and critical capital-project funds to state, territorial, tribal and local governments of the United States to be used for various purposes, including efforts to respond to the COVID-19 public health emergency; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to appropriate and authorize disbursement of \$4,000,000 in local Coronavirus relief funds in accordance with the ARP Act for the provision of COVID-19 testing, vaccinations, and other health-related needs and services as more specifically provided herein; now, therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Findings. It is hereby ascertained,

- (a) The recitals set forth herein are true and correct.
- (b) The disbursements and actions authorized hereby to fund relief efforts to address the spread of COVID-19 will benefit the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Duval County.
- (c) The distribution of ARP Act funds as set forth herein is necessary and appropriate, and is reasonable and not excessive, taking into account the extent of the public benefits expected to be derived from the expenditures authorized hereby, and taking into account all other forms of assistance available.
- (d) The authorizations provided by this Ordinance are for public uses and purposes for which the City may use its powers as a county, municipality and as a political subdivision of the State of Florida to expend public funds, and the necessity in the public interest for the provisions herein enacted is hereby declared as a matter of legislative determination.
- (e) This Ordinance is adopted pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 163, 166 and 125, Florida Statutes, as amended, the City's Charter, and other applicable provisions of law.
- Section 2. Appropriation. For the 2020-2021 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

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(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

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The funding appropriated above represents \$4,000,000 in Coronavirus relief, fiscal recovery, and critical capital projects funds received by the City from the federal government pursuant to the ARP Act.

Section 3. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 2 is to support continued COVID-19 response efforts by providing funds for COVID-19 testing, vaccinations, and other health-related needs and services in accordance with the ARP Act.

Section 4. Oversight Department. The Finance and Administration Department shall provide oversight for all ARP Act expenditures authorized hereunder.

Section 5. Carryover. The funds appropriated in Section 2 of this Ordinance shall not lapse but shall carryover into fiscal year 2021-2022.

Section 6. Requesting Emergency Passage Upon Introduction Pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. Emergency passage upon introduction of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that access to safe, readily available COVID-19 testing opportunities, vaccinations, and other vital health-related services is necessary to protect the health, safety and welfare of the City's residents. Since the federal and state COVID-19 testing sites closed in June, there has been a significant increase in the number of COVID-19 positive cases. Many residents are required to wait in long lines, often in inclement weather, or are waiting 3 to 4 days for an appointment to be tested for COVID-19, which is contributing to the continued spread of the virus. Emergency passage of this legislation is necessary to expedite opening additional COVID-19 testing locations in Duval County in an effort to prevent further spread of the Coronavirus throughout the community.

Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become
