AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING A \$3,295,342.00 GRANT FROM THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES (THE "DEPARTMENT") TO FUND THE ADVANCING HEALTH LITERACY TO ENHANCE EQUITABLE RESPONSES TO COVID-19 IN JACKSONVILLE HEALTH ZONE 1 PROGRAM (THE "PROGRAM"), AS INITIATED BY B.T. 21-109; PURPOSE OF THE APPROPRIATION; PROVIDING FOR CARRYOVER OF FUNDS TO FISCAL YEAR 2022-2023; APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER AGREEMENTS WITH (1) HEALTH PLANNING COUNCIL OF NORTHEAST FLORIDA, INC., (2) THE EIGHTH & WHITNER GROUP, LLC, AND (3) EDWARD WATERS UNIVERSITY, INC.; INVOKING THE EXCEPTION OF SECTION 126.107(G) (EXEMPTIONS), PART 1 (GENERAL REGULATIONS, CHAPTER 126 (PROCUREMENT CODE), ORDINANCE CODE, TO DIRECT CONTRACT WITH HEALTH PLANNING COUNCIL OF NORTHEAST FLORIDA, INC., THE EIGHTH & WHITNER GROUP, LLC, AND EDWARD WATERS UNIVERSITY, INC., FOR THE PROVISION OF SERVICES RELATED TO THE PROGRAM, AS MORE PARTICULARLY DESCRIBED HEREIN; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE OFFICE OF GRANT AND CONTRACT COMPLIANCE; REQUESTING ONE CYCLE EMERGENCY PASSAGE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

21 Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in 22 Section 1 is to fund a broad range of activities aimed at serving 23 Jacksonville's urban core population which is a population of some of the City's most vulnerable citizens. Grant funds must be expended 24 25 in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Department's Grant Award (Award Number 1 CPIMP211270-01-00) dated June 18, 2021, attached 26 27 hereto as **Exhibit 2** and incorporated herein by this reference (the "Grant"). The Grant funds will be used to support a variety of 28 29 initiatives that provide protective resources and education related 30 to matters of health, including access to information about disease 31 rates, testing, treatment, and mitigating behaviors. The programming

and initiatives funded by the Grant include, but are not limited to, 1 the Mayor's Health Literacy Media Campaign, Edward Waters University, 2 3 Inc.'s Center for the Prevention of Health Disparities, and the procurement of professional services from Health Planning Council of 4 5 Northeast Florida, Inc. and The Eighth & Whitner Group, LLC for the provision of services in support of the Program for the Grant period 6 7 commencing July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2023 as follows: (1) \$2,517,687.00 to Health Planning Council of Northeast Florida, Inc.; 8 9 (2) \$50,000.00 to The Eighth & Whitner Group, LLC; and (3) \$227,655.00 10 to Edward Waters University, Inc. for the Center for the Prevention of Health Disparities. All Program activities shall be completed in 11 12 strict compliance with the Grant and applicable federal, state and local rules and regulations. 13

Section 3. Carryover. The funds appropriated in this
Ordinance shall not lapse but shall carryover to fiscal year 20222023.

authorization 17 Section 4. Approval and to execute an agreement between the City and Health Planning Council of Northeast 18 19 Florida, Inc. The Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation 20 Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver an agreement 21 between the City of Jacksonville and Health Planning Council of 22 Northeast Florida, Inc. in a not to exceed amount of \$2,517,687.00, for oversight and administration of the Program, including project 23 24 direction, coordination, contract management, and procurement of 25 contractual services from partner agencies who will provide 26 additional services for the Program as more particularly described in **Exhibit 3**, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this 27 28 reference. The agreement may include such extensions, renewals, 29 additions, deletions and changes as may be reasonable, necessary and incidental for carrying out the purposes thereof, as may be acceptable 30 to the Mayor, or his designee, with such inclusion and acceptance 31

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being evidenced by execution of the agreement by the Mayor, or his 1 designee; provided however, no modifications to the agreement may 2 increase the financial obligations or liability of the City to an 3 amount in excess of the amount stated in the agreement or decrease 4 5 the duties and obligations of Health Planning Council of Northeast Florida, Inc., and any such modifications shall be technical only and 6 7 shall be subject to appropriate legal review and approval by the Office of General Counsel and the Office of Risk Management for 8 9 appropriate insurance and indemnification terms. For the purposes 10 of this Ordinance, the term "technical changes" is defined as those changes having no financial impact to the City and any other non-11 12 substantive changes that do not substantively increase the duties and responsibilities of the City under the provisions of the agreement. 13

Approval to execute an agreement between the City and The Eighth & Whitner Group, LLC. 15 The Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby 16 17 authorized to execute and deliver an agreement between the City of Jacksonville and The Eighth & Whitner Group, LLC in a not to exceed 18 amount of \$50,000.00, to provide marketing and community relations 19 20 services in support of the Program, as more particularly described 21 in **Exhibit 4**, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this 22 reference. The agreement may include such extensions, renewals, 23 additions, deletions and changes as may be reasonable, necessary and 24 incidental for carrying out the purposes thereof, as may be acceptable 25 to the Mayor, or his designee, with such inclusion and acceptance 26 being evidenced by execution of the agreement by the Mayor, or his 27 designee; provided however, no modifications to the agreement may 28 increase the financial obligations or liability of the City to an 29 amount in excess of the amount stated in the agreement or decrease the duties and obligations of The Eighth & Whitner Group, LLC, and 30 any such modifications shall be technical only and shall be subject 31

For the purposes of this Ordinance, the term "technical changes" is defined as those changes having no financial impact to the City and any other non-substantive changes that do not substantively increase the duties and responsibilities of the City under the provisions of the agreement.

Section 6. execute 8 Approval and authorization to an 9 agreement between the City and Edward Waters University, Inc. ("EWU"). 10 The Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver an agreement between the City of 11 Jacksonville and Edward Waters University, Inc. in a not to exceed 12 amount of \$227,655.00, for the provision of services in support of 13 the Program through EWU's Center for the Prevention of Health 14 Disparities, as more particularly described in **Exhibit 5**, attached 15 hereto and incorporated herein by this reference. The agreement may 16 17 include such extensions, renewals, additions, deletions and changes as may be reasonable, necessary and incidental for carrying out the 18 purposes thereof, as may be acceptable to the Mayor, or his designee, 19 20 with such inclusion and acceptance being evidenced by execution of the agreement by the Mayor, or his designee; provided however, no 21 22 modifications to the agreement may increase the financial obligations 23 or liability of the City to an amount in excess of the amount stated 24 in the agreement or decrease the duties and obligations of EWU, and 25 any such modifications shall be technical only and shall be subject 26 to appropriate legal review and approval by the Office of General 27 Counsel and the Office of Risk Management for appropriate insurance 28 and indemnification terms. For the purposes of this Ordinance, the 29 term "technical changes" is defined as those changes having no financial impact to the City and any other non-substantive changes 30 that do not substantively increase the duties and responsibilities 31

of the City under the provisions of the agreement.

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2 Section 7. Invoking the exception to Section 126.107(g), 3 The City is hereby authorized to enter direct Ordinance Code. agreements or amendments to agreements, as authorized herein, with 4 5 Health Planning Council of Northeast Florida, Inc., The Eighth & Whitner Group, LLC, and Edward Waters University, Inc., for the 6 7 purposes of providing services for the Program. Pursuant to Section 126.107(g) (Exemptions), Part 1 (General Regulations), Chapter 126 8 9 (Procurement Code), Ordinance Code, such procurement is exempted from 10 competitive solicitation because the supplies or services are to be provided by those specifically described 11 in the authorizing 12 legislation that appropriates the same. With the exception of the foregoing, all other provisions of Chapter 126, Ordinance Code, shall 13 remain in full force and effect. The failure of any entity identified 14 15 herein to enter into the applicable agreement or amendment to the agreement with the City shall render such entity ineligible to receive 16 17 the Grant funds authorized hereby.

18 Section 8. Oversight Department. The Office of Grant and 19 Contract Compliance shall oversee administration of the Grant and 20 Program described herein.

21 Section 9. Requesting One Cycle Emergency Passage Pursuant 22 to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. One cycle emergency passage of 23 this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is to 24 provide expedited COVID-19 health literacy and vaccination assistance 25 to Jacksonville Health Zone 1. In addition, the U.S. Department of 26 Health and Human Services requires the contracts funded under the 27 Grant be acquired within the first thirty (30) days of the Grant 28 period and a detailed workplan and subrecipient monitoring plan be 29 completed within the first sixty (60) days of the Grant period.

30 Section 10. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become 31 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
