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## ORDINANCE 2021-669

5 AN ORDINANCE MAKING CERTAIN FINDINGS AND APPROPRIATING \$1,900,000 IN CORONAVIRUS RELIEF, 6 7 FISCAL RECOVERY, AND CRITICAL CAPITAL PROJECTS 8 FUNDS FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF TREASURY IN 9 ACCORDANCE WITH THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT OF 2021 (THE "ARP ACT") TO SUPPORT CONTINUED COVID-10 11 19 RESPONSE EFFORTS AND IMMEDIATE ECONOMIC 12 STABILIZATION AND TO REPLACE LOST REVENUE; 13 AUTHORIZING AND AWARDING VARIOUS DISBURSEMENTS OF ARP ACT FUNDING RECOMMENDED BY EACH OF THE 19 14 15 COUNCIL MEMBERS, TO ELIGIBLE ORGANIZATIONS OF THEIR CHOICE, PROVIDING THESE ORGANIZATIONS MEET 16 17 ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA OF THE ARP ACT; THE PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE FINANCE AND 18 PROVIDING ADMINISTRATION DEPARTMENT; 19 А 20 CARRYOVER OF FUNDS TO 2021-2022, AND PROVIDING THAT ANY ARP ACT GRANT FUNDING NOT EXPENDED 21 22 PURSUANT TO THIS ORDINANCE BY SEPTEMBER 30, 2022 SHALL REVERT TO THE FUND OF ORIGIN; PROVIDING 23 24 FOR COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE ARP ACT GRANT 25 FUNDING REQUIREMENTS; AUTHORIZING THE CITY TO 26 COVID-19 GRANT AGREEMENTS ENTER INTO WITH 27 VARIOUS GRANT PROGRAM GRANT RECIPIENTS; INVOKING EXCEPTION OF 126.107(G) (EXEMPTIONS), 28 THE 29 CHAPTER 126 (PROCUREMENT CODE), ORDINANCE CODE, TO DIRECT CONTRACT WITH 30 GRANT RECIPIENTS; 31 REQUESTING EMERGENCY PASSAGE UPON INTRODUCTION;

## PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 ("COVID-19") was first discovered in the United States in January 2020 and since that time this severe, acute respiratory illness has infected over 32 million and killed over 610,000 Americans; and

7 WHEREAS, the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic have been severe 8 and far-reaching, affecting all facets of the American economy and 9 daily life, resulting in the highest national unemployment rates in 10 over seventy years, creating food and housing insecurity for a 11 significant portion of the population, and leading to economic harm 12 and disruption to businesses and organizations of all sizes and to 13 governments at all levels; and

WHEREAS, the United States federal government recognizes that state, territorial, tribal and local governments have been called on to respond to COVID-19 at an immense scale, including efforts to prevent and address spread of the disease, while also launching major efforts to address the economic impacts of the pandemic as efficiently as possible in a manner that is tailored to meet the specific needs of each community; and

21 WHEREAS, on March 11, 2021, the American Rescue Plan Act (the 22 "ARP Act") was signed into law and provided for the distribution of 23 Coronavirus relief, fiscal recovery, and critical capital projects 24 funds to state, territorial, tribal and local governments of the 25 United States; and

WHEREAS, the ARP Act provides that these funds may be used for various projects and purposes that include: (1) small business economic assistance, (2) aid to nonprofit organizations, (3) aid to tourism, travel, or hospitality industries, and (4) aid to social determinants of health programs; and

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WHEREAS, the City of Jacksonville (the "City") recognizes that

quick and efficient distribution of these ARP Act funds will further bolster the City's efforts to rebuild and recover the local economy; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to appropriate and authorize disbursement of \$1,900,000 in local fiscal recovery funds in accordance with the ARP Act to those eligible organizations located in the City of Jacksonville that have suffered economic harm as a result of COVID-19, in such amounts as more fully set forth herein on Exhibit 1; now therefore

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**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Findings. It is hereby ascertained, determined, found and declared as follows:

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(a) The recitals set forth herein are true and correct.

(b) The grants and actions authorized hereby will provide economic relief that encourages recovery of the local economy and benefits the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Duval County.

(c) The distribution of ARP Act funds as set forth herein is necessary and appropriate, and is reasonable and not excessive, taking into account the extent of the public benefits expected to be derived from the grants and other relief authorized hereby, and taking into account all other forms of economic assistance available.

(d) The authorizations provided by this Ordinance are for public uses and purposes for which the City may use its powers as a county, municipality and as a political subdivision of the State of Florida to expend public funds, and the necessity in the public interest for the provisions herein enacted is hereby declared as a matter of legislative determination.

(e) This Ordinance is adopted pursuant to the provisions of
Chapters 163, 166 and 125, Florida Statutes, as amended, the City's
Charter, and other applicable provisions of law.

Section 2. Appropriation. For the 2020-2021 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(C) **Explanation of Appropriation:** 

12 The funding appropriated above represents \$1,900,000 as 13 approved in Ordinance 2021-463-E in Coronavirus relief, 14 fiscal recovery, and critical capital projects funds 15 received by the City from the federal government pursuant 16 to the ARP Act. These funds will be used to support 17 continued COVID-19 response efforts and will provide a vital infusion of funds to assist with immediate economic 18 19 recovery and stabilization efforts through eligible 20 expenses under the ARP Act.

21 Section 3. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in 22 Section 2 is to authorize various disbursements of ARP ACT contingency 23 funding, awarding varied amounts to eligible organizations up to 24 \$100,000 recommended by each of the 19 council members, providing 25 these organizations meet the eligibility criteria of the ARP ACT.

26 Section 4. Oversight Department. The Finance and 27 Administration Department shall provide oversight for all contracts, 28 contract amendments, and expenditures authorized hereunder.

29 Section 5. Carryover. The funds appropriated herein shall 30 not lapse but shall carryover as appropriated to fiscal year 2021-31 2022. Funds appropriated in this Ordinance must be spent before

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September 30, 2022, failure to do so will cause said funds to revert
 to accounts of origin, subject to future Council approval.

3 Section 6. Compliance with applicable American Rescue Plan 4 Act grant funding requirements. The awarding organization selected 5 by the respective council member shall comply with all applicable ARP 6 Act grant requirements in their respective use and expenditure of the 7 ARP Act funds provided pursuant to this Ordinance including, but not 8 limited to, the audit requirements attached hereto as Exhibit 3.

9 Section 7. Approval and authorization to execute COVID-19 ARP Act Subrecipient Grant Agreement. There is hereby approved, and 10 11 the Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby 12 authorized to execute and deliver standard COVID-19 ARP Act 13 Subrecipient Grant Agreements (the "Agreements") between the City of 14 Jacksonville and the grant recipients in the form attached hereto as 15 **Exhibit 4.** Distrobution of grant funds to the grant recipients are 16 contingent upon (1) grant recipients' completion of the Agreements 17 and (2) review and approval of the same by the City. The Agreements 18 may include such additions, deletions and changes as may be 19 reasonable, necessary and incidental for carrying out the purposes 20 set forth in this ordinance, including any amendments deemed necessary 21 to comply with federal law applicable to the grant funds authorized 22 by the Agreements, as may be acceptable to the Mayor, or his designee, 23 with such inclusion and acceptance being evidenced by execution of 24 an Agreement with the respective grant recipient by the Mayor, or his 25 designee; provided however, no modifications to the Agreements may 26 increase the financial obligations or liability of the City, and any 27 such modifications shall be subject to appropriate legal review and 28 approval by the Office of General Counsel.

29 Section 8. Invoking the Exception to Section 30 **126.107(g)**, Ordinance Code. The City is hereby authorized to enter 31 into direct agreements, as authorized herein, with the Grant

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Recipients for the purposes of providing COVID-19 relief 1 and 2 assistance as more fully set forth herein. Pursuant to Section 3 126.107(g) (Exemptions), Part 1 (General Regulations), Chapter 126 4 (Procurement Code), Ordinance Code, such procurement is exempted from 5 competitive solicitation because the supplies or services are to be provided by those specifically prescribed within authorizing 6 7 legislation that appropriates the same. With the exception of the foregoing, all other provisions of Chapter 126, Ordinance Code, shall 8 remain in full force and effect. The failure of any entity identified 9 10 herein to enter into the applicable agreement with the City shall 11 render such entity ineligible to receive the grant funds authorized 12 hereby.

13 Section 9. Requesting emergency passage pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. Emergency passage upon introduction of this 14 15 legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that the ARP 16 Act funds must be spent by September 30, 2022, and the ongoing effects 17 of the global pandemic are immediately impacting small businesses, nonprofit organizations, tourism, travel, and hospitality industries, 18 19 and public health sectors of Jacksonville and urgent action is needed 20 to appropriate the ARP Act funding to these organizations.

21 Section 10. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall 22 become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming 23 effective without the Mayor's signature.
