AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$800,000 (\$400,000 IN GRANT FUNDS FROM THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF CHILDREN AND FAMILIES, \$85,000 CASH MATCH FROM THE KIDS HOPE ALLIANCE JUVENILE JUSTICE PREVENTION & INTERVENTION ESSENTIAL SERVICE CATEGORY, AND \$315,000 IN IN-KIND CONTRIBUTION) TO IMPLEMENT THE CRMINAL JUSTICE, MENTAL HEALTH, AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE REINVESTMENT GRANT PROGRAM (THE "PROGRAM") TO INCREASE PUBLIC SAFETY AND IMPROVE THE ACCESSIBILITY AND EFFECTIVENESS OF TREATMENT SERVICES FOR JUVENILES SUFFERING FROM MENTAL ILLNESS, SUBSTANCE ABUSE DISORDERS, OR CO-OCCURING MENTAL HEALTH AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE DISORDERS, AND WHO ARE IN, OR AT RISK OF ENTERING, THE CRIMINAL OR JUVENILE JUSTICE SYSTEMS, FOR THE FIRST YEAR OF THE THREE (3) YEAR GRANT TERM BEGINNING JULY 1, 2021 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2022, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 21-092; AMENDING FIFTH REVISED SCHEDULE M TO ORDINANCE 2020-511-E; INVOKING THE EXCEPTION TO SECTION 126.107(G), ORDINANCE CODE, WITH RESPECT TO SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED BY MANAGED ACCESS TO CHILD HEALTH, INC.; APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY, AND/OR THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF THE KIDS HOPE ALLIANCE, TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER A CONTRACT WITH MANAGED ACCESS TO CHILD HEALTH, INC. FOR THE PROVISION OF PROFESSIONAL SERVICES NECESSARY FOR LOCAL IMPLEMENTATION AND EXPANSION OF THE PROGRAM; WAIVING THE REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 77.111(A) (PROVIDER CONTRACTS), CHAPTER 77 (KIDS HOPE ALLIANCE), ORDINANCE CODE, TO EXEMPT THE SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED BY MANAGED ACCESS TO CHILD HEALTH, INC. FROM COMPETITIVE PROCUREMENT; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE KIDS HOPE ALLIANCE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2020-2021 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above comprises \$400,000.00 in grant funds from the Florida Department of Children and Families, an additional appropriation of \$85,000.00 from the Kids Hope Alliance ("KHA"), and \$315,000.00 in in-kind contribution consisting of security services provided by JSO at the Juvenile Assessment Center for implementation of the Criminal Justice, Mental Health and Substance Abuse Reinvestment Grant Program.

Section 2.

Section 1 is to fund the first year of local implementation and expansion of the Criminal Justice, Mental Health and Substance Abuse Reinvestment Grant Program (the "Program") for the period beginning July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022. The overall grant term is three (3) years beginning July 1, 2021 and ending June 30, 2024. A copy of the Florida Department of Children and Families Criminal Justice, Mental Health and Substance Abuse Reinvestment Grant Award Notice # DCF RFA 2021-001 is attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference. A copy of the budget schedule reflecting the intended sources and uses of funds for the first year of the grant is attached hereto as Exhibit 3.

Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in

Section 3. Amending Fifth Revised Schedule M to Ordinance 2020-511-E. There is hereby amended for the fiscal year 2020-2021 budget for the Kids Hope Alliance by substituting in the place of Fifth Revised Schedule M, approved by Ordinance 2020-511-E, the Sixth Revised Schedule M, attached hereto as Revised Exhibit 4, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 4, 6th Rev Sched M, September 7, 2021 - NCSPHS" and incorporated herein by this reference. The Sixth Revised Schedule M will reflect additional transfers and funds appropriated herein.

Section 4. Invoking the exception to Section 126.107(g), Ordinance Code. KHA is hereby authorized to procure professional services from Managed Access to Child Health, Inc. ("MATCH") for local implementation and expansion of the Program in compliance with the grant authorized in Section 1 above. Pursuant to Section 126.107(g) (Exemptions), Part 1 (General Regulations), Chapter 126 (Procurement Code), Ordinance Code, such services are exempted from competitive solicitation because the services to be provided are being approved via authorizing legislation pursuant to this Ordinance.

deliver a contract between KHA and Managed Access to Child Health, Inc. pursuant to which MATCH will provide professional services necessary for local implementation and expansion of the Program in compliance with the grant authorized in Section 1. Section 6. Waiver of the requirements of Chapter 77 (Kids

Chief Executive Officer of KHA, are hereby authorized to execute and

Hope Alliance), Section 77.111(a) (Provider Contracts), Ordinance Code. The City hereby waives the requirements of Chapter 77 (Kids Hope Alliance), Section 77.111(a) (Provider Contracts), Ordinance Code, with respect to the contract with Managed Access to Child Health, Inc. approved and authorized in Section 5 of this Ordinance. Section 77.111(a) requires contracts for children's services provided by third parties to be competitively procured by KHA via an evaluated bid process. This waiver is needed in order to allow KHA to directly contract with Managed Access to Child Health, Inc. to provide the Program services included in the approved grant application.

Section 7. Oversight Department. The Kids Hope Alliance shall oversee administration of the grant and the Program.

Section 8. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
