A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER
AS FAMILY COURT AWARENESS MONTH; PROVIDING AN
EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the concept for Family Court Awareness Month began after Tina Swithin's arduous ten-year custody battle, with the intent to shine a spotlight on the topic of family courts while honoring the young lives traumatized or lost during separation or divorce legal procedures; and

WHEREAS, domestic violence does not necessarily stop when an abusive relationship ends, there may be post-separation abuse and also pain and suffering during the custody process within the family court system. Ms. Swinthin's custody battle created years of distress, but thankfully ended without tragedy. Other families have not been so fortunate, with at least 806 children murdered by separating or divorcing parents in the US since 2008; and

WHEREAS, all parties - Judges, Guardian ad Litem, Custody Evaluators, Therapists and Attorneys - working in the family court system should have proper training on domestic violence, childhood trauma and post separation abuse in order to maximize children's safety; and

WHEREAS, the mission of Family Court Awareness Month is to educate judges and other family court professionals on the empirical data and research that is currently available. Such research is a critical component to making decisions that are truly in the best interest of children. This research includes The Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACE) Study (CDC-Kaiser Permanente), Saunder's Study (US Department of Justice), The Meier Study: Child Custody Outcomes in Cases Involving Abuse Allegations, and the Santa Clara Law Study (Confronting the
