A RESOLUTION DECLARING OCTOBER AS BREAST CANCER ACTION MONTH IN JACKSONVILLE AND ENCOURAGING ALL CITIZENS TO SUPPORT EFFORTS TO RAISE AWARENESS OF AND EXPAND ACCESS TO BREAST CANCER SCREENING AND TREATMENTS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, October 2021 marks 36 years that National Breast Cancer Awareness Month has educated women about early breast cancer detection, diagnosis, and treatment, highlighting the importance of awareness that leads to action; and

WHEREAS, breast cancer is the most common cancer among women in the United States, and one in 8 women, and one in 833 men, will be diagnosed with breast cancer in their lifetime; and

WHEREAS, every two minutes a woman in the United States is diagnosed with breast cancer, and 85 percent of women diagnosed with breast cancers have no family history of the disease; and

WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society estimates that in 2021, more than 280,000 women will be diagnosed with invasive breast cancer, and more than 40,000 will die due to the disease, which early detection can render 98 percent treatable; and

WHEREAS, the two most common barriers to life-saving screening are lack of financial means and access to transportation. Due to the current unprecedented times, these barriers have become even more pronounced; and

WHEREAS, in 2020, Pink Ribbon Jax raised funds toward a 3D-Mobile Mammogram Bus for Baptist Health and stage III clinical trials for the breast cancer vaccine for Mayo Clinic, Jacksonville. This
