7 AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$910,471.00 FROM THE
8 FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY THROUGH THE
9 STATE OF FLORIDA DIVISION OF EMERGENCY
10 MANAGEMENT UNDER THE HAZARD MITIGATION
11 ASSISTANCE GRANT PROGRAM TO FUND THE ACQUISITION
12 AND INSTALLATION OF SEVEN (7) PERMANENT
13 GENERATORS AT SEVEN (7) STORMWATER PUMP STATION
14 SITES WITHIN DUVAL COUNTY, AS INITIATED BY
15 REVISED B.T. 21-038; AMENDING THE 2021-2025
16 FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN APPROVED BY
17 ORDINANCE 2020-505-E TO PURCHASE AND INSTALL
18 PERMANENT EMERGENCY GENERATORS AT THE FOLLOWING
19 LOCATIONS: HILLMAN DRIVE, MYRTLE AVENUE, HILLY
20 ROAD, BRADLEY ROAD, JESSIE STREET, MCGIRTS CREEK
21 PARK/LEW BRANTLEY AND SANDALWOOD CANAL;
22 PROVIDING FOR CITY OVERSIGHT BY THE DEPARTMENT
23 OF PUBLIC WORKS, PUBLIC BUILDINGS DIVISION;
24 PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
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26 **BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

27 **Section 1. Appropriation.** For the 2020-2021 fiscal year,
28 within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated
29 sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s)
30 listed in subsection (b):

6 (c) Explanation of Appropriation:

7 The funding above represents a Hazard Mitigation Grant
8 Program ("HMGP") award in the amount of \$910,471.00 from
9 the Federal Emergency Management Agency ("FEMA") through
10 the State of Florida Division of Emergency Management
11 ("FDEM") to fund the acquisition and installation of
12 elevated emergency generators and supporting
13 infrastructure at seven (7) stormwater pump station sites
14 within Duval County to reduce and/or mitigate damage from
15 severe weather or other hazards. A local match of 25% is
16 required and will be appropriated as part of the fiscal
17 year 2021-2022 budget.

18 **Section 2. Purpose.** The purpose of the appropriation in
19 Section 1 is to fund the acquisition and installation of seven (7)
20 permanent emergency generators and supporting electrical
21 infrastructure at the following seven (7) stormwater pump station
22 sites within Duval County (the "Project"): Hillman Drive, Myrtle
23 Avenue, Hilly Road, Bradley Road, Jessie Street, McGirts Creek
24 Park/Lew Brantley and Sandalwood Canal (collectively, the "Pump
25 Stations"). The generators will allow for continuous connectivity
26 and operation of the Pump Stations in the event of an outage during
27 severe weather events and other emergency situations. These functions
28 are considered critical to public safety. All activities shall be
29 completed in strict compliance with applicable federal, state and
30 local rules and regulations.

31 The term of the grant, and the period of performance for the

1 Project, shall begin upon the City and FDEM's execution of that
2 certain Federally-Funded Subaward and Grant Agreement Number HO543
3 (the "Grant Agreement") and shall end on July 31, 2023. A copy of
4 the Grant Agreement has been placed **Revised On File** with the Office
5 of Legislative Services.

6 **Section 3. Capital Improvement Plan Amendment.** Ordinance
7 2020-505-E, adopting the 2021-2025 Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan
8 (the "CIP") for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is
9 hereby amended to provide funding for the Project, as more fully
10 described in the Project Information Sheet, attached hereto as **Revised**
11 **Exhibit 2** and incorporated herein by this reference. The City Council
12 finds that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next
13 annual budget and CIP review will be detrimental to the best interests
14 of the community because such deferral will delay the acquisition and
15 installation of urgently-needed emergency generator systems at
16 multiple critical stormwater pump station locations to reduce and/or
17 mitigate the damage that might otherwise occur from severe weather
18 or other hazards. Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), *Ordinance Code*,
19 enactment of this ordinance requires the affirmative vote of two-
20 thirds of the City Council members present at the meeting because of
21 the CIP amendment set forth in this section. This ordinance shall
22 constitute an amendment to Ordinance 2020-505-E. In all other
23 respects, the Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan approved by
24 Ordinance 2020-505-E shall remain unchanged and continue in full
25 force and effect.

26 **Section 4. Oversight Department.** The Department of Public
27 Works, Public Buildings Division, shall oversee the Project and
28 administration of the Grant Agreement described herein.

29 **Section 5. Effective Date.** This ordinance shall become
30 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
31 without the Mayor's signature.
