AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$25,000 FROM THE NORTHWEST OFFICE OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT (OED) (SUPERMARKET INCENTIVE PROGRAM) FUND PROFESSIONAL SERVICES ACCOUNT TO THE NORTHWEST OFFICE OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT FUND - SUBSIDIES & CONTRIBUTIONS TO PRIVATE ORG. ACCOUNT FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING A GRANT TO OVERFLOW HEALTH ALLIANCE, INC. (OHA) IN THE UP-TO AMOUNT OF \$25,000.00 TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR THE PURCHASE ADDITIONAL FOOD INVENTORY AND NECESSARY UPGRADES TO THE CEILING AND AIR CONDITIONING SYSTEM OF THE MAKING ENDS MEAT GROCERY STORE (THE "GROCERY STORE"), A COMMUNITY-BASED STORE WHICH SERVES AS A SOURCE OF AFFORDABLE, HEALTHY OPTIONS AND PROVIDES ACCESS FOOD TO FOOD, ELDERLY, AND EDUCATIONAL SERVICES FOR THE SESSIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF HEALTHY FOODS, INITIATED BY B.T. 21-125; PROVIDING CARRYOVER OF FUNDS INTO SUBSEQUENT FISCAL YEARS UNTIL SUCH FUNDS ARE EXPENDED OR LAPSE ACCORDING TO THE AGREEMENT; APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF THE INVENTORY FUNDING AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE AND OVERFLOW

HEALTH ALLIANCE, INC. AND OTHER DOCUMENTS BY THE MAYOR OR HIS DESIGNEE AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY; AUTHORIZING APPROVAL OF TECHNICAL AMENDMENTS; WAIVING THE CRITERIA FOR THE FOOD DESERT PILOT PROJECT APPROVED BY ORDINANCE 2019-768-E; PROVIDING FOR CITY OVERSIGHT BY THE OED; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, in Ordinance 2018-195-E, the City Council earmarked \$3,000,000.00 in funding from the Northwest Jacksonville Economic Development Trust Fund ("NWJEDF") to incentivize the operation of new supermarkets and healthy food programs within the northwest area of Jacksonville (the "Northwest Area"); and

WHEREAS, such supermarket incentives and healthy food programs are intended to alleviate the food desert areas within the Northwest Area and thus benefit the health, safety, and public welfare of Northwest Area residents; and

WHEREAS, in April of 2020, Overflow Health Alliance, Inc. ("OHA") founded Making Ends Meat Grocery Store (the "Grocery Store") in order to operate a community-based store as a source of affordable, healthy food options and provide access to food, services for the elderly, and educational sessions for the preparation of healthy foods; and

WHEREAS, in order to provide as much fresh food as possible to residents in the Northwest Area community, the City of Jacksonville (the "City"), through its Office of Economic Development, desires to supplement the operational costs of the Grocery Store, including assistance with necessary upgrades to the ceiling and air conditioning system of the Grocery Store and by purchasing additional food inventory; now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

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Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2020-2021 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

- (c) Explanation of Appropriation: The funding above is an appropriation of funds from the Northwest Office of Economic Development (OED) Fund (Supermarket Incentive Program) Professional Services Account to the Northwest Office of Economic Development (OED) Fund Subsidies & Contributions to Private Org. Account to supplement the operational costs of the Grocery Store, including assistance with necessary upgrades to the ceiling and air conditioning system of the Grocery Store and by purchasing additional food inventory.
- Section 2. Purpose of Appropriation. The purpose of the appropriation above is to assist OHA in operating a community-based store as a source of affordable, healthy food options and providing access to food, services for the elderly, and educational sessions for the preparation of healthy foods through a grant to Grocery Store for necessary upgrades to the ceiling and air conditioning system of Grocery Store and by purchasing additional food inventory.
- Section 3. Carryover. The funds appropriated hereby shall not lapse but shall carryover to subsequent fiscal years until such funds are expended or lapse according to the Agreement.
 - Section 4. Approval and authorization. There is hereby

approved, and the Mayor or his designee and Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the City, the Inventory Funding Agreement between the City of Jacksonville and Overflow Health Alliance, Inc., attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference (the "Agreement"). Agreement authorizes an advanced lump sum payment. The Agreement may include such additions, deletions, and changes as may be reasonable, necessary, and incidental for carrying out the purposes thereof, as may be acceptable to the Mayor, or his designee, with such inclusion and acceptance being evidenced by execution of the Agreement by the Mayor or his designee. No modification to the Agreement may increase the financial obligations or the liability of the City and any such modification shall be technical only and shall be subject to appropriate legal review and approval of the General Counsel, or his or her designee, and all other appropriate action required by law. "Technical" is herein defined as including, but not limited to, in legal descriptions and surveys, descriptions changes infrastructure improvements and/or any road project, ingress and egress, easements and rights of way, performance schedules (provided that no performance schedule may be extended for more than one year without Council approval), design standards, access, and site plan which have no financial impact.

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Section 5. Further Authorizations. The Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute the Agreement and all other contracts and documents and otherwise take all necessary action in connection therewith and herewith, and to negotiate and execute all necessary changes and amendments to the Agreement and other contracts and documents in order to effectuate the purposes of this Ordinance, without further Council action, provided such changes and amendments are limited to amendments that are technical in nature (as described in Section 4
