## ORDINANCE 2021-601-E

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER A LOCALLY-FUNDED AGREEMENT (LUMP-SUM CONTRIBUTION) BY AND AMONG THE STATE OF FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION ("FDOT"), THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE, AND THE JACKSONVILLE TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY PURSUANT TOΑ FEDERAL RAILROAD ADMINISTRATION CONSOLIDATED RAIL INFRASTRUCTURE AND IMPROVEMENTS GRANT AWARDED TO THE FDOT FOR THE PURPOSE OF MITIGATING JACKSONVILLE'S FREIGHT TRAIN-VEHICLE/PEDESTRIAN/BICYCLIST CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE ENGINEERING AND CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT DIVISION OF THE CITY'S DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS; PROVIDING ΑN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Authorization to Execute. The Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the City, that certain Locally-Funded Agreement (Lump-Sum Contribution) by and among the State of Florida Department of Transportation ("FDOT"), the City of Jacksonville, and the Jacksonville Transportation Authority ("JTA"),

in substantially the same form as is attached hereto as  ${\tt Exhibit 1}$  and incorporated herein by this reference (the "Agreement"). Agreement authorizes an advanced lump sum payment. The Federal Railroad Administration awarded the FDOT a Consolidated Rail Infrastructure and Safety Improvements Grant to provide funding for the Mitigating Jacksonville's Freight Train-Vehicle/Pedestrian/Bicyclist Conflicts project (the "Project"). purpose of the Project is to alleviate significant conflicts between freight trains and vehicular, pedestrian and bicyclist traffic at major arteries that connect communities to downtown Jacksonville. Pursuant to the Agreement, the City of Jacksonville agrees to provide a contribution of \$978,875.00 towards estimated Project costs. City's contribution will be funded from a proposed project in the fiscal year 2021-2022 Capital Improvement Plan and is contingent upon City Council approval.

Section 2. Oversight. The Engineering and Construction Management Division of the Department of Public Works shall oversee the project described herein.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
