RESOLUTION 2021-772

A RESOLUTION ENCOURAGING THE MAYOR TO TAKE TAKE FORMAL ACTION AND REAPPOINT THE GENERAL COUNSEL QUALIFICATION REVIEW COMMITTEE AND CONDUCT A LOCAL, STATE AND NATIONAL SEARCH TO FILL THE VACANCY FOR THE GENERAL COUNSEL FOR THE CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT OF JACKSONVILLE, DUVAL COUNTY, FLORIDA; ESTABLISH A MINIMUM PERIOD OF TIME TO ACCEPT APPLICATIONS FOR CONSIDERATION BY THE GENERAL COUNSEL QUALIFICATION REVIEW COMMITTEE OF A PERIOD NO LESS THAN 30 DAYS; ENCOURAGING THE MAYOR TO CONSIDER THE NEEDS OF THE ENTIRE CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT AND SEEK INPUT FROM THE CONSTITUTIONAL OFFICES AND INDEPENDENT AGENCIES IN THE SELECTION OF THE GENERAL COUNSEL; DIRECTING THE CHIEF OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES TO FORWARD A COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION TO THE MAYOR, CHAIR OF THE GENERAL COUNSEL QUALIFICATION REVIEW COMMITTEE AND CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER OF THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE; REQUESTING EMERGENCY PASSAGE UPON INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on August 6, 2021, the General Counsel for the Consolidated Government of Jacksonville, Duval County, Florida, Jason Gabriel, resigned thereby creating a vacancy in the position of General Counsel. An "Acting" General Counsel", Jason Teal, was

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appointed to ensure the continued faithful operation of the Office of General Counsel; and

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WHEREAS, Article 7 of the Charter of the City of Jacksonville, 3 regarding the Office of General Counsel, articulates the process for 4 5 filling a vacancy in the position of General Counsel and requires the mayor to appoint a General Counsel Qualification Review Committee 6 7 comprised of five attorneys licensed to practice in the State of Florida. The General Counsel Qualification Review Committee did not 8 9 meet until Tuesday, September 14, 2021, more than 38 days after the 10 resignation of the former General Counsel, Jason Gabriel. Initially, the General Counsel Qualification Review Committee attempted to 11 forego advertising and accepting any additional applications for the 12 position of General Counsel, thereby nominating "Acting" General 13 Counsel, Jason Teal, to the Mayor for the General Counsel position. 14 Such action would have occurred with few articulated considerations 15 to the responsibility for addressing the needs and furnishing legal 16 17 services for the entire consolidated government, especially the Constitutional Offices and the Duval County School Board. The General 18 Counsel Qualification Review Committee's position 19 was only 20 reconsidered after two Council Members shared concerns about the integrity and lack of transparency of 21 the General Counsel Qualification Review Committee's action were that were to occur; and 22

WHEREAS, during the General Counsel Qualification Review 23 24 Committee's meeting on September 14, 2021, it was stated that the 25 position for the General Counsel would be advertised beginning Monday, 26 September 20, 2021 and run for two weeks. Instead the advertising for the position for General Counsel, a notice advertisement was placed 27 in the Daily Record only on Friday, September, 17, 2021, Monday 28 through Friday, September 20-24, 2021 and Monday through Friday, 29 September 27, 2021 through October 1, 2021. The advertisement for the 30 31 position of General Counsel was not posted via any of the methods

that positions for attorneys for the Office of General Counsel are usually advertised, nor was it forwarded to the Florida Bar for posting; and

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WHEREAS, on August 8, 2021, one day after his appointment then 4 "Acting" General Counsel, Jason Teal's salary was increased from 5 \$156,000 annually to \$229,325 annually, an increase of \$73,325 6 7 annually, which was the annual salary of former General Counsel, Jason Gabriel. This significant salary increase on the aforementioned 8 9 date, may be interpreted to support the belief that the decision to 10 nominate "Acting" General Counsel, Jason Teal, to the position of General Counsel was a forgone conclusion prior to convening the 11 General Counsel Qualification Review Committee meeting and without 12 consideration and consultation of the needs and furnishing legal 13 services to the entire consolidated government, especially the 14 and the Duval 15 Constitutional Offices County School Board. Additionally, "Acting" General Counsel Jason Teal 16 has both reorganized the Office of General Counsel and implemented raises for 17 some members of the the Office of General Counsel in his "Acting" 18 capacity in a manner that is less than transparent and fair which may 19 20 erode the trust, services and effectiveness of the Office of General 21 Counsel. Further, these acts may have served as a chill effect or an 22 inhibition on the various entities of the consolidated government to 23 articulate its needs and opinions regarding the selection of the 24 General Counsel out of fear or reprisal if the the Mayor's selection 25 of "Acting" General Counsel Jason Teal was not supported; and,

WHEREAS, over the course of the last few years, various entities of the consolidated government, DCSB and the Police and Fire Pension Board, have each been denied outside legal services without prior written approval by the General Counsel. The Supervisor of Elections Office and Duval County Canvasing Board promulgated policies and procedures crafted by the Office of General Counsel that purportedly

contravened the US Constitution, Florida Constitutional and Charter 1 2 and allowed a partisan Senior Judge to chair the Election Canvasing Board in arguable violation of both the Charter and the Florida 3 Constitution, until the former Jacksonville City Council President 4 requested removal of the Senior Judge and recalculation of early 5 6 A federal grand jury is currently empaneled to review the votes. 7 actions surrounding the sale of the JEA, specifically the attempted fraudulent sale of our municipal utility with both a lack of 8 9 transparency and integrity. The former General Counsel, Jason 10 Gabriel, was called as a witness to testify before the grand jury regarding this matter. The essential nature of the Office of General 11 Counsel and hence the General Counsel to the consolidated government 12 of Jacksonville, Duval County, Florida, require both discussion and 13 review of these matters before a General Counsel is appointed. Such 14 discussion may further evidence the need of a General Counsel who is 15 not currently an attorney in the Office of General Counsel; and, 16

WHEREAS, the General Counsel confirmation requires 13 members of the Jacksonville City Council to vote in favor of the nominee and the aforementioned matters were not addressed by the General Counsel Qualification Review Committee or Mayor. The City Council Members, as a co-equal branch of the consolidated government, are unable to vote in the affirmative without these matters being addressed; and

WHEREAS, the members of the City Council continue to receive concerns from constituents and the public voicing their strong opposition to the lack of integrity, transparency and quality of the process undertaken by the Mayor and the General Counsel Qualification Review Committee and the essential role of the General Counsel on all facets of the consolidated government; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

30 Section 1. Encouraging the Mayor to take formal action and 31 reappoint the General Counsel Qualification Review Committee and

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1 conduct a local, state and national search for a highly qualified candidate to the position of General Counsel. The Council strongly 2 encourages the Mayor to reappoint the General Counsel Qualification 3 Review Committee that met on September 14, 2021 and October 4, 2021. 4 5 Further, the Council encourages the Mayor to conduct a local, state 6 and National search for a highly qualified candidate for the position 7 of General Counsel, who will address the needs and legal matters of all entities of the consolidated government. Specifically, the 8 9 Council humbly asks the Mayor establish a minimum period of 30 days 10 to advertise the position of General Counsel, consults with the entire consolidated government, especially the Constitutional Offices and 11 the Duval County School Board regarding their legal needs and concerns 12 regarding the General Counsel, and engages in a process that 13 incorporates integrity, transparency and is duly noticed to the 14 constituency of the consolidated government. 15

Section 2. Directing to forward. The Chief of 16 the Legislative Services Division is hereby directed to forward a copy 17 of this resolution for distribution to the Mayor, Chair of the General 18 Counsel Qualification Review Committee and Chief Administrative 19 20 Officer.

21 Section 3. Requesting emergency passage upon introduction pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. Emergency passage upon 22 introduction of this legislation is requested. The nature of the 23 24 emergency is that the resolution appointing the General Counsel is 25 being introduced and City Council is being requested consider this appointment. This is similar to the 2019-894-E which was acted upon 26 as an emergency regarding the JEA ITN and interaction or limited 27 interaction by the City Council regarding the cone of silence. 28

Section 4. Effective Date. This resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
