AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$47,500.00 IN GRANT FUNDING FROM THE FLORIDA FISH AND WILDLIFE "FWC") CONSERVATION COMMISSION (THE FOR REIMBURSEMENT OF THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE'S COSTS TO REMOVE THREE DERELICT VESSELS IN CITY WATERWAYS; OF JACKSONVILLE PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE NEIGHBORHOODS DEPARTMENT, ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY DIVISION; REQUESTING ONE CYCLE EMERGENCY PASSAGE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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The funding above represents an appropriation of \$47,500.00 in grant funding from the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (the "FWC") for reimbursement to the City of the costs to remove three derelict vessels located in public waterways within the City.

6 Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in 7 Section 1 is to appropriate grant funding from the FWC to offset the City's costs for removal of three derelict vessels located in public 8 9 waterways within the City. Pursuant to that certain State of Florida 10 Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission Agreement No. 20399 ("Contract #20399"), the FWC will reimburse the City up to \$27,500.00 11 for removal of one 21-foot white vessel in the state waters of 12 Julington Creek, northeast of Clark's Fish Camp, and one 21-foot 13 green vessel at Mandarin Point in the St. Johns River, south of the 14 15 Buckman Bridge. Removal of these vessels must occur prior to expiration of Contract #20399 on October 22, 2021. 16 In addition, 17 pursuant to that certain State of Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission Agreement No. 21034 ("Contract #21034"), the 18 19 FWC has agreed to reimburse the City up to \$20,000.00 for removal of 20 one 38-foot white Bayliner Cabin Cruiser in the Broward River behind 21 1223 Cedar Bay Road. Removal of this vessel must be completed prior 22 to expiration of Contract #21034 on October 15, 2021. Copies of 23 Contract #20399 and Contract #21034 are **On File** with the Office of 24 Legislative Services.

25 **Section 3. Oversight.** The Environmental Quality 26 Division of the Neighborhoods Department shall provide oversight of 27 the project described herein.

28 Section 4. Requesting One Cycle Emergency Passage Pursuant 29 to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. One cycle emergency passage of this 30 legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that the 31 removal of the derelict vessels and submittal of reimbursement

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1 requests to the FWC must be completed prior to expiration of Contract 2 #20399 and Contract #21034 as stated herein.

3 Section 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become 4 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 5 without the Mayor's signature.
