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## **ORDINANCE 2021-778**

AN ORDINANCE REGARDING THE CONFIRMATION OF THE MAYOR'S APPOINTMENT OF JASON R. TEAL AS THE GENERAL COUNSEL PURSUANT TO SECTION 7.03 OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE; WAIVING COUNCIL RULE 4.1103 (CONFIRMATION OF THE GENERAL COUNSEL), COUNCIL RULES, AS TO THE REQUIREMENT UPON INTRODUCTION OF ANY RESOLUTION CONFIRMING THE APPOINTMENT OR REAPPOINTMENT OF THE GENERAL COUNSEL, LEGISLATIVE SERVICES SHALL NOTIFY THE CLERK OF COURT, PROPERTY APPRAISER, SHERIFF, SUPERVISOR OF ELECTIONS, TAX COLLECTOR AND CHAIRPERSON OF THE DUVAL COUNTY SCHOOL BOARD AND ENCOURAGE THEM TO PROVIDE ORAL OR WRITTEN INPUT AND GUIDANCE AS TO THE FITNESS OF THE APPOINTEE TO BE GENERAL COUNSEL; REQUESTING EMERGENCY PASSAGE UPON INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the selection of the General Counsel is governed by the City of Jacksonville Charter (the "Charter"), Section 7.03 (Selection and Term of the General Counsel); and

WHEREAS, in accordance therewith, following the resignation of the former General Counsel Jason R. Gabriel on August 6, 2021, Mayor Curry empaneled the General Counsel's Qualification Review Committee consisting of the designee of the Jacksonville Bar Association President, two former general counsels of the City and two members of the Florida Bar Board of Governors; and

WHEREAS, during the pendency of the vacancy, Mayor Curry appointed an acting General Counsel pursuant to Charter Section 7.05 (Vacancy) for a period not to exceed 90 days from the effective date of the vacancy on August 7, 2021 in order for there to be continuity and an orderly operation in the Office of General Counsel; and

WHEREAS, the 90-day period is scheduled to expire at the end of November 4, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the General Counsel's Qualification Review Committee commenced meeting in September 2021 and advertised for interested candidates for the General Counsel position for two weeks; and

WHEREAS, on October 4, 2021, the General Counsel's Qualification Review Committee voted unanimously to strongly recommend Acting General Counsel Jason R. Teal be appointed as General Counsel; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Teal graduated with Honors from Florida State University College of Law in 1998; he has been employed with the Office of General Counsel since October 2000, including as an Assistant General Counsel from October 2000 to February 2010, when he was promoted to Chief of the Office's Regulatory Division; he served as Regulatory Chief from February 2010 until November 2015, when he was promoted to Deputy General Counsel over the Office's Regulatory and Constitutional Law Department; and

WHEREAS, during his tenure with the Office of General Counsel, Mr. Teal has represented clients from nearly every aspect and element of the Consolidated City government and has participated in numerous critical and significant matters involving and defending the Charter, the Ordinance Code and the overall interests of the Consolidated City; and

WHEREAS, Mayor Lenny Curry has found that the interests of the Consolidated Government will be best served by appointing Mr. Teal as General Counsel; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the process outlined in Charter

Section 7.03, the Mayor filed Resolution 2021-770 seeking the Council's confirmation of the appointment of Jason R. Teal as General Counsel; and

WHEREAS, on October 19, 2021, in compliance with Council Rule 4.1101, Mr. Teal appeared in front of the Rules Committee and was interviewed by the members of said Committee and visiting members of Council; and

WHEREAS, during its October 19th meeting and prior to interviewing Mr. Teal, the Rules Committee discussed Council Rule 4.1103 (Confirmation of the General Counsel), which requires that upon introduction of any resolution confirming the appointment or reappointment of the General Counsel, Legislative Services shall notify the Clerk of Court, Property Appraiser, Sheriff, Supervisor of Elections, Tax Collector and Chairperson of the Duval County School Board and encourage them to provide oral or written input and guidance to the Rules Committee and any other committee considering said appointment or reappointment, as to the fitness of the appointee to be General Counsel; and

WHEREAS, the Legislative Services Division confirmed that notice to the Constitutional Officers and the Chair of the Duval County School Board had not been provided prior to the October 19<sup>th</sup> Rules Committee meeting, thus necessitating the subsequent filing of this legislation at the request of the Rules Committee in order to waive the aforementioned notice requirement in Council Rule 4.1103 and to ensure the appointment of Jason R. Teal as General Counsel can be acted upon in a timely manner prior to the expiration of the 90-day period outlined in Section 7.05(a) of the Charter; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Recitals. The above recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by this reference.

Waiver of Council Rule 4.1103 (Confirmation of Section 2. General Counsel), Council Rules. Council Rule the 4.1103 (Confirmation of the General Counsel), Part 11 (Appointments and Confirmations), Chapter 4 (Procedures), Council Rules, is hereby waived as to the requirement that upon the introduction of any resolution confirming the appointment or reappointment of the General Counsel, Legislative Services shall notify the Clerk of Court, Property Appraiser, Sheriff, Supervisor of Elections, Tax Collector and Chairperson of the Duval County School Board and encourage them to provide input as to the fitness of the appointee to be General Counsel. The Legislative Services Division confirmed this notice was not provided prior to the October 19th meeting of the Rules Committee. This waiver is necessary to ensure Resolution 2021-770 confirming the appointment of Jason R. Teal as General Counsel is acted upon prior to the expiration of the 90-day period described in Section 7.05(a) of the Charter on November 4, 2021.

pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. Emergency passage upon introduction of this Ordinance is requested. The nature of the emergency is that section 7.05(a) of the Charter authorizes an acting general counsel to be appointed for a maximum of 90 days from the commencement of the vacancy. The former General Counsel's resignation was on August 6, 2021, creating a vacancy as of August 7, 2021. The 90-day period expires at the end of November 4, 2021, requiring passage of this Ordinance no later than the Council meeting on October 26, 2021.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.

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
