WHEREAS, Joel Raymond "Ray" Moore, a Jacksonville native and the son of a long-time Jacksonville firefighter, graduated from Andrew Jackson High School and, following college, returned to the school as a teacher and coach; and

WHEREAS, following his teaching career, Mr. Moore was for many years a successful State Farm insurance agent; and

WHEREAS, Ray Moore is best known to the general public as the "father of the Veterans Memorial Wall" for his initiation and leadership of the project to finance and construct a memorial to all the Jacksonville citizens who gave their life in military service to the country; and

WHEREAS, during his time as a student at Andrew Jackson High School, Mr. Moore became interested in a hand-lettered calligraphy certificate displaying the names of Andrew Jackson students who had died in World War II, given by the Class of 1947. He later found that the certificate had become water-damaged and had been removed for storage, and that planted the seed for his desire to appropriately memorialize veterans who made the ultimate sacrifice in a more permanent and prominent way; and

WHEREAS, in the 1990s Ray Moore spent countless hours researching and collecting the names of more than 1,700 service men
