AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING 1,440,000.00 FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE JACKSONVILLE SHERIFF'S OFFICE FOR ADMINISTRATION OF THE MISDEMEANOR PROBATION PROGRAM FOR DUVAL COUNTY, FLORIDA, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 22-010; PURPOSE OF APPROPRIATION; AUTHORIZING POSITIONS, AS INITIATED BY R.C. 22-014; AMENDING CHAPTER 37 (OFFICE OF THE SHERIFF), PART 1 (ORGANIZATION), SECTION 37.111 (SCHEDULE OF FEES), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ESTABLISH FEES FOR THE MISDEMEANOR PROBATION PROGRAM; AMENDING JACKSONVILLE SHERIFF'S OFFICE FEES ATHTTP://WWW.JAXSHERIFF.ORG/FEES TO PROVIDE FEES FOR THE MISDEMEANOR PROBATION PROGRAM; PROVIDING FOR A DIRECTIVE TO THE LEGISLATIVE SERVICES DIVISION TO CIRCULATE ENACTED LEGISLATION TO THE JACKSONVILLE SHERIFF'S OFFICE FOR IMMEDIATE UPDATE OF FEES ONLINE; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION INSTRUCTIONS; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT OF THE PROGRAM BY THE JACKSONVILLE SHERIFF'S OFFICE; REQUESTING ONE CYCLE EMERGENCY PASSAGE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Duval County, Florida is currently operated by a local branch of The Salvation Army, a Georgia not-for-profit corporation; and

WHEREAS, Section 948.15, Florida Statutes, provides that a private or public entity under the supervision of the governing body of the county or the court may provide probation services for offenders sentenced by the county court; and

WHEREAS, The Salvation Army's contract for the provision of misdemeanor probation services for Duval County, Florida expires on November 30, 2021, and the City of Jacksonville has designated the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office ("JSO") to assume responsibility for administration of the Program; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to an Administrative Order from the Chief Judge of the Fourth Judicial Circuit, JSO will assume responsibility for administration of the Program effective December 1, 2021; and

WHEREAS, funds for this Program will be paid by individuals sentenced to misdemeanor probation through the Duval County court system; and

WHEREAS, the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office is requesting the City Council approve this legislation to appropriate funds to pay the costs for the first year of the Program and to establish the various fees to be collected from misdemeanor probationers to pay for administration of the Program moving forward; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Recitals. The recitals set forth above are true and correct and incorporated berein by this reference.

Section 2. Appropriation. For the 2021-2022 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above is an appropriation within the General Fund Jacksonville Sheriff's Office for the estimated revenue and expenditures related to the administration of the Misdemeanor Probation Program for Duval County, Florida for the period of December 1, 2021 through September 30, 2022.

Section 3. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation above is to provide funding for JSO to assume responsibility for the Program effective December 1, 2021. The Jacksonville Sheriff's Office Department of Corrections will provide client-centric misdemeanor probation services for all of Duval County, Florida. These services will focus on criminogenic needs, risk to reoffend needs, and court ordered probation requirements.

Authorization of Positions. There are hereby Section 4. authorized the positions more fully described in R.C. 22-014, attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference.

Chapter 37 (Office of the Sheriff), Part 1 Section 5. (Organization), Section 37.111 (Schedule of fees), Ordinance Code, amended. Chapter 37 (Office of the Sheriff), Part 1 (Organization), Section 37.111 (Schedule of fees), Ordinance Code, is hereby amended to read as follows:

CHAPTER 37 - OFFICE OF THE SHERIFF

PART 1. - ORGANIZATION

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- (d) The Office of Sheriff-Correction's Division shall charge the following fees:
 - (1) Inmate Medical Co-Pay at the Pre-Trial Detention Facility:
 - (i) Sick Visit;
 - (ii) Emergency Visit;
 - (2) Inmate Dental Visit;
 - (3) Inmate Prescription;
 - (4) Inmate Subsistence Fee (per day);
 - (5) Notary Services; -
 - (6) Probation costs of supervision and probation services:
 - (i) Monthly Supervision;
 - (ii) Urinalysis Testing;
 - (iii) Electronic Monitoring;
 - (iv) Probation Violation;
 - (v) Vehicle Immobilization;
 - (vi) Community Service Insurance;
 - (vii) Mandated Education Programs.
 - Section 6. Amending Jacksonville Sheriff's Office Fees.

The Jacksonville Sheriff's Office fees which were directed by Ordinance 2017-665-E to be published http://www.jaxsheriff.org/fees are hereby amended to reflect new fees for the Misdemeanor Probation Program and the provision of supervision and probation services, as reflected in Exhibit 3 attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 7. Directive to Legislative Services Division. Chief of the Legislative Services Division is hereby directed to forward a copy of the enacted legislation to the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office, attention Chief William Clement at. William.Clement@jaxsheriff.org, for immediate fee to

Section 8. Codification Instructions. The Codifier and the Office of General Counsel are authorized to make all chapter and division "tables of contents" consistent with the changes set forth herein. Such editorial changes and any others necessary to make the Ordinance Code consistent with the intent of this legislation are approved and directed herein, and changes to the Ordinance Code shall be made forthwith and when inconsistencies are discovered.

Section 9. Oversight. The Jacksonville Sheriff's Office shall oversee and administer the Program as described herein.

Section 10. Requesting One Cycle Emergency Passage Pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. One cycle emergency passage of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that the the contract with the current misdemeanor probation services provider expires on November 30, 2021. The City of Jacksonville will be required to provide these services beginning December 1, 2021 to remain compliant with state statute.

Section 11. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
