Staff Report on Proposed 2021B Series Text Amendment to add a Property Rights Element to the 2030 Comprehensive Plan

ORDINANCE 2021-631

Ordinance 2021-631 is an amendment to add a Property Rights Element (PRE) to the 2030 Comprehensive Plan. House Bill 59, signed by the Governor on June 29, 2021, requires that local government comprehensive plans include a property rights element by the earlier of the date of adoption of the next proposed plan amendment that is initiated after July 1, 2021, or the date of the next scheduled evaluation and appraisal of the comprehensive plan, which is November 1, 2023.

The general intent of the new element is to ensure that private property rights are considered in local decision making and that government respects judicially acknowledged and constitutionally protected private property rights.

The Planning and Development Department recommends APPROVAL of the text amendment in the attached EXHIBIT 1 submitted as Ordinance 2021-631.

ORDINANCE 2021-631

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE 2021B SERIES TEXT AMENDMENT TO THE 2030 COMPREHENSIVE PLAN OF THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE, TO ADD A PROPERTY RIGHTS TO THE 2030 COMPREHENSIVE PLAN, ELEMENT SECTION 163.3177(6), FLORIDA REQUIRED BYSTATUTES; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Planning and Development Department has initiated certain revisions and modifications to the text of the Comprehensive Plan in accordance with the procedures and requirements set forth in Chapter 650, Part 4, Ordinance Code, to facilitate the appropriate and timely implementation of the plan, and has provided the necessary supporting data and analysis to support and justify the amendments determined to be required, and accordingly, has proposed certain revisions and modifications, which are more particularly set forth in Exhibit 1, dated May 11, 2021, attached hereto, incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, the City, by the adoption of Ordinance 2021-334-E, approved this amendment to the 2030 Comprehensive Plan for transmittal to the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO), as the State Land Planning Agency, and other required state agencies, for review and comment; and

WHEREAS, by various letters and e-mails, the DEO and other state reviewing agencies transmitted their comments, if any, regarding this proposed amendment to the 2030 Comprehensive Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Development Department reviewed the proposed revisions, considered all comments received, prepared a

written report and rendered an advisory recommendation to the Council with respect to this proposed amendment to the 2030 Comprehensive Plan; and

whereas, the Planning Commission, as the Local Planning Agency, held a public hearing on this proposed amendment to the 2030 Comprehensive Plan, with due public notice having been provided, and reviewed and considered all comments received during the public hearing, and made a recommendation to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 650.408, Ordinance Code, the Land Use and Zoning Committee held a public hearing in accordance with the requirements of Chapter 650, Part 4, Ordinance Code, on this proposed amendment to the 2030 Comprehensive Plan, and has made its recommendation to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 163.3184(3), Florida Statutes, and Chapter 650, Part 4, Ordinance Code, the City Council held a public hearing, with public notice having been provided, on this proposed amendment to the 2030 Comprehensive Plan; and

WHEREAS, the City Council further considered all oral and written comments received during the public hearings, including the data collection and analysis portions of this proposed amendment to the 2030 Comprehensive Plan, the recommendations of the Planning and Development Department and the Planning Commission, the final recommendations of the Land Use and Zoning Committee, and the comments, if any, of the DEO and the other state agencies; and

WHEREAS, in the exercise of its authority, the City Council has determined it necessary and desirable to adopt this proposed amendment to the 2030 Comprehensive Plan to preserve and enhance present advantages, encourage the most appropriate use of land, water and resources, consistent with public interest, overcome present deficiencies, and deal effectively with future problems that may result from the use and development of land within the City of

Jacksonville; now, therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Purpose and Intent. This Ordinance is adopted to carry out the purpose and intent of, and exercise the authority set out in, the Local Government Comprehensive Planning and Land Development Regulation Act, Sections 163.3161 through 163.3248, Florida Statutes, and Chapter 166, Florida Statutes, as amended. The amendment adds a Property Rights Element to the 2030 Comprehensive Plan of the City of Jacksonville, as required by Section 163.3177(6), Florida Statutes.

Section 2. Amendment to Comprehensive Plan. The 2030 Comprehensive Plan is hereby amended to include the new Property Rights Element from the 2021B Series, as required by Section 163.3177(6), Florida Statutes, which has been initiated by the Planning and Development Department, as more particularly set forth in Exhibit 1, dated May 11, 2021, attached hereto, and incorporated herein by reference.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon the signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.

GOAL, OBJECTIVE AND POLICIES

GOAL 1

The City will recognize and respect judicially acknowledged and constitutionally protected private property rights in accordance with the Community Planning Act established in Chapter 163, Florida Statues.

Objective 1.1 Local decision making shall be implemented and applied with sensitivity for private property rights and shall not be unduly restrictive.

Policies 1.1.1

The City will ensure that private property rights are considered in local decision making.

1.1.2

The following rights shall be considered in local decision making:

- 1. The right of a property owner to physically possess and control his or her interests in the property, including easements, leases, or mineral rights.
- 2. The right of a property owner to use, maintain, develop, and improve his or her property for personal use or for the use of any other person, subject to state law and local ordinances.
- 3. The right of the property owner to privacy and to exclude others from the property to protect the owner's possessions and property.
- 4. The right of a property owner to dispose of his or her property through sale or gift.
