Presentation by Renee Goode-Manna, JEA

Renee Goode-Manna with JEA provided an update on Hurricane Nicole recovery. 70,000 customers lost power at some point during the storm; there was 1 boil water advisory issued due to a water main broken by an uprooted tree, and 1 sanitary sewer overflow due to a broken pipe. JEA's Integrated Resource Plan is exploring the future of electric generation and transmission over the next 20-30 years and a number of stakeholders are participating in the planning process. Supply chain issues include shortages of pad-mounted transformers, cable, and pole-mounted transformers. New supplies of transformers have been located via an overseas manufacturer and are on their way. JEA communicates weekly with the Northeast Florida Builders Association to inform them of when new transformers are being activated in new developments. CM DeFoor asked about the transformer supply; Ms. Manna said they are now using a foreign supplier to get the needed units. In response to a question from Ms. DeFoor, Ms. Manna said the Plant Vogtle nuclear station in Georgia has been approved to load fuel into Unit 3, which should be operational in the first quarter of 2023.
