Chairwoman Pittman welcomed newly elected Council Member Reggie Gaffney Jr. to the committee. The attendees introduced themselves for the record and the Chair reviewed the agenda items.

Presentation by Chief Powers, JFRD

Fire Chief Keith Powers gave an update on fire station construction projects. Four fire stations are currently under construction. Two are 98-100% complete (#4 and #10), one is approximately 80% complete (#65) and another is less than 20% complete (#75). Ten other stations are in varying stages of planning, design, and land acquisition in preparation for construction in the next several years.

CM DeFoor asked about Station #68; Chief Powers said that will be a marine-only fireboat station that will be in the southern portion of the city, possibly on land donated by NAS Jacksonville. CM Morgan asked if land has been acquired for Fire Stations #66 and 67. Chief Powers said it has not because those stations are in the CIP in the "beyond 5 years" category. Station #66 will be somewhere in the vicinity of Merrill Road and Hartsfield Road, pursuant to the TriData consultant report. Chairwoman Pittman asked whether Fire Station #4 downtown is a designated historic landmark. Chief Powers said that it is not, despite having been built in 1927. He described the factors that are used to determine where new stations need to be located, which include distance between stations, the number of calls each station runs, and traffic and road conditions that affect response time from each station.

Chief Administrative Officer Brian Hughes described the nature of the emergency to get the mooring infrastructure work started in time for the ship to move from its current location by March 31, 2023. DIA Executive Director Lori Boyer explained that her ability to grant extensions of the ship's contractual obligation deadline to be in its final location ends on March 31st. Jim Webb with the Jacksonville Historic Naval Ship organization described the history of the ship acquisition and the potential locations at Pier 1 or Pier 4. At CM Carlucci's request, Ms. Boyer described how the ship fits into the Shipyards West development scheme. For the last 8 years all planning for the Northbank waterfront has been done with the understanding that the Orleck would be at Pier 1 in conjunction with the Fire Museum. She said that the DIA intends to introduce new legislation shortly to memorialize the changes in conditions that affect the agreement. Mr. Webb said the contract for the Pier 1 mooring work was signed by the Orleck organization last week and by Hal Jones Construction today.

CM Carlucci asked Mr. Hughes about the City's commitment to do what it takes to make the USS Orleck project successful. Mr. Hughes described how the City has been accommodating to the project in the areas of permitting, fee waivers, docking location and contract extensions. CM Morgan asked about the nature of the relationship between the USS Orleck organization and William Harrell and his proposed Veterans Museum organization. Mr. Webb described the relationship between the two organizations which are separate but hope to be complementary to each other in attracting visitors interested in military history. Mr. Harrell said that he has raised \$2 million in private funds and is working with Florida Speaker of the House Paul Renner on another \$2 million in state funds toward his Veterans Museum project. He said that locating the Orleck at Pier 1 will kill that project and his because of the lack of visitor parking in the area.

COMMENT:

The Jacksonville Historic Naval Ship Association has not yet provided DIA evidence of funding necessary to complete the project in the amount of \$2,656,719. This is a requirement to enter into the future license agreement to operate the ship museum. The license agreement must be entered into by 3/31/23.

Public Comment

Carnell Oliver said that white supremacists are threatening Jacksonville and the Mayor should take the Confederate monuments down immediately. The Florida Legislature needs to enact bipartisan gun control legislation. Jacksonville needs to tackle its racism problem.

Bruce Fouraker thanked the committee for its emergency vote in favor of the USS Orleck. 2022-874 should be supported to raise the power lines at Blount Island to improve access to the port by larger ships.

William Harrell said his comments on 2022-875 are now largely irrelevant given his inability to address the committee before the vote was taken. He understands that the mooring work contracts are contingent upon favorable Council action on the bill next week. He said that going back to the USS Adams process 10 years ago and continuing through the USS Orleck, the ordinances and contracts all referred to the street address that matches Pier 4. How that has come to be changed to Pier 1 deserves to be researched. Parking is crucial to the success of any development at Pier 1 and he does not believe that sufficient parking will be available at that site given the state's restrictions on use of the land.

John Nooney recommended that the USS Orleck be relocated to the new bulkhead behind the Performing Arts Center and said the Tourist Development Council could provide funding for the project from the reserve funds being appropriated next week. He advocated for a kayak launch on Catherine Street. He said he has been shut out of the FIND process for the last 2 years. FIND funds could help with the Orleck project.
