CONCERN

This amended agreement authorizes 100% of the City funding to be provided to Mayport Waterfront, Inc. in advance as opposed to on a reimbursement basis. While the amended agreement will require evidence that the prior payments have been fully expended by Mayport Waterfront, Inc. before the next installment is paid, the advancement of 100% of funding is not standard for City Grant agreements.

Trista Carraher, Auditor's Office, explained the amendment and the Auditor's concern related to advance payments.

Former Council Member Bill Gulliford was in attendance representing Mayport Waterfront Inc. He described the group's activities and progress toward crafting a redevelopment plan for Mayport Village. He advocated for this funding as necessary for the all-volunteer group to move the plan toward completion.

- Expresses support for a J-bill which proposes to amend Section 212.0306, Florida Statutes, to allow the City of Jacksonville/Duval County the ability to levy the following local option food and beverage taxes, subject to future approval by City Council:
- 2% tax on the sale of food, beverages, or alcoholic beverages in hotels and motels only
- 1% tax on the sale of food, beverages, or alcoholic beverages in establishments licensed by the state to sell alcoholic beverages for consumption on premises (except for hotels and motels) with annual gross revenues greater than \$400,000 (not applicable to alcoholic beverages sold by the package for off-premises consumption)
- The revenue from the local option tax on hotels and motels must be allocated to a countywide convention and visitors bureau to be used for promoting and advertising tourism and funding convention bureaus, tourist bureaus, tourist information centers, and news bureaus
- The revenue from the local option tax on restaurants must be used to assist persons who have become, or are about to become, homeless for the first 12 months. Thereafter, not less than 15% of funds must be made available for construction and operation of domestic violence centers.
- The levy of these taxes would require approval of an ordinance adopted by a majority vote of City Council

There was a lengthy discussion about this bill. CM Boylan spoke about the purpose of this bill and the CQLI Special Committee final report that recommended a recurring funding source for homeless services. He said that if approved the tax would be one tool in the toolbox to assist those who are unhoused.

CM Peluso explained that the bill was procedural, in that local governments must request permission from the state to levy a tax. He said that the request, if approved by the state, would not enact said tax but would enable the City to do so in the future if approved through council legislation. If passed in Tallahassee, City Council could have two new options: an optional 1% tax on food and beverages sold at restaurants with a liquor license and an optional 2% tax on food and beverages sold in hotels and motels. CM Peluso noted that the potential tax would be added to the bills of consumers not the restaurants' revenue. The tax would have increased costs for customers when dining out at those restaurants, such as adding an extra \$1 on a \$100 bill, and the funds would have then been split into a homelessness trust fund and a fund specifically for those impacted by domestic violence.

CM Arias presented some data regarding the point in time count of unsheltered individuals.

CP Salem talked about a newly created trust fund, into which he donated leftover funds from his installation ceremony (\$14,000). He said that he will be proposing an additional appropriation of \$500,000 into the trust fund for homeless services and that the Mayor has indicated she will match those funds.

CM Johnson spoke about how homelessness is a multi-faceted issue, and about symbolism and how approving the tax would signify the City's commitment to finding solutions.

CMs Miller, J. Carlucci, Freeman and White all expressed agreement on finding some way to provide funds for homeless services without levying a tax, particularly one that impacts a specific industry.

CM Boylan made a motion to reluctantly withdraw the bill as it seemed it would not pass in a Rules Committee vote. He added a caveat that his hope is his colleagues find a different path to funds for assistance for those experiencing homelessness.

CMs J. Carlucci and Freeman shared that they are working on alternative legislative solutions, but did not provide details.

Public Comment: There were numerous attendees present to speak on this bill in both opposition and support (24 speaker cards included as an attachment with these minutes). Those in opposition talked about the burden on the hospitality industry and the threat of decreased business due to an additional tax. Those in support highlighted the need for dedicated recurring funds to support homeless services and affordable housing, and the impact from the tax implemented in Miami in the 1990's which helped to reduce the number of those homeless and brought in roughly \$30 million in revenue last year.
