Trista Carraher, Auditor's Office, explained the amendment.

CP Salem explained that the amendment changes the name of the Homelessness Initiatives Special Revenue Fund to Homelessness Diversion Special Revenue Fund. He said that the pilot program will provide up to \$1,500 per household in diversion assistance for first-time homeless individuals or families to obtain temporary or permanent housing and other necessities.

Arias 2 CM J Carlucci revised the amendment to move \$200,000 from the Emergency Homelessness Relief /Non-congregate Shelter initiative to the Homelessness Prevention Special Revenue Fund. The \$200,000 for the Homelessness Diversion/Problem Solving Pilot was previously reallocated to the Permanent Supportive Housing Pilot Program through NCSPHS amendment 2. Approved by voice vote 5-0

Howland 1 CM Howland explained that the funding for the Train the Trainer program should be reduced to \$50,000, with \$110,000 balance to operating reserves - Approved by voice vote 5-0

CM J. Carlucci made a motion to move \$1 million from local stack funding below the line for the Homeless Prevention Special Revenue Fund - Approved by voice vote 5-0

Motion/2nd move to approve the bill as an emergency, 7 times amended: Boylan/Miller
