Attendance: CP Salem - Visiting CM Carlucci - Visiting CM Carrico - Visiting CM Clark-Murray - Visiting CM Howland - 2023-806 CM Peluso - Visiting CM Pittman - Visiting Michael Fackler, General Counsel, was in attendance to answer questions about Mayoral authority and appropriations as related to the 12/26/23 removal of a confederate monument in Springfield Park (Women of the Southland). Council President Salem said the questions should pertain to the removal process, not the monument itself.

CP Salem indicated that the monument removal was an infringement on the power of council even though the costs were covered through a private donation. CP Salem questioned why the draft opinion shared with the media was not signed nor dated by OGC. He asked if Mr. Fackler stands by the draft or if he would make changes to the language. Mr. Fackler said he would modify the use of language related to the Mayor's "exclusive authority" over parks.

CP Salem asked if Mr. Fackler had consulted the Planning Department about a COA (certificate of appropriateness) required for exterior work in a historic district or to a local landmark. He asked about restrictions to Mayoral authority in the Ordinance Code and Charter. He expressed concerns that something similar could happen again, and said he is working on legislation to prevent a reoccurrence. CP Salem asked about a memo written by previous General Counsel, Bob Rhodes, about certificates of appropriateness and historic structures. Mr. Fackler said that per his analysis the Women of the Southland monument was not a protected contributing structure in Springfield Park. Mr. Fackler said the monument was not designated as a local landmark or historical structure. He said that the Procurement Division and Parks Department were consulted on the removal, but not the Planning Department. There was discussion about Capital Improvement projects and the threshold for projects that have a total cost greater than \$100,000. Mr. Fackler said that per his analysis, the monument removal was not a capital project which by definition is one that leads to the acquisition, construction, or extension of the useful life of capital assets. He also said that it is his view that there were not limitations on the use of private donation funds for the removal.

CM Carrico talked about how the monument has been treated as an historical landmark previously, in that COAs were utilized for painting and maintenance. He asked about the timing of the request, and the perceived rush to remove the monument. Bill Delaney, Mayor's Office, said security was the consideration for not publicizing the removal. Mr. Fackler said that sometimes COAs are utilized unnecessarily out of an abundance of caution.

CM Howland reiterated his request for a formal GC opinion about a series of questions about "extralegal actions", public and/or private funding appropriated for a public purpose without council approval, capital improvement project requirements, and the potential removal of other monuments in the city. There was a discussion about the definition of City revenue.

CM Carlucci talked about the lack of push back after removal of a confederate statue in James Weldon Johnson Park under the Curry Administration, the lack of historical designation of the Women of the Southland monument, and the benefit of a strong mayor form of government if/when council is unable or unwilling to take action on the right side of history. He talked about his bill to remove the monument in 2022 that failed 13-6, without much discussion.

CM Joe Carlucci asked about risk and liability if actions are taken based on a draft unsigned legal opinion. He spoke about demolition as a form of capital improvement.

CM Peluso asked if there was an OGC opinion issued when Mayor Curry removed the statue in JWJ park (there was not), and he highlighted that the Women of the Southland monument did not have an

historic designation. CM Peluso noted that Mr. Fackler served previously as the President of Jacksonville Historical Society, and that Alan Bliss, Jacksonville Historical Society Executive Director, corroborated the lack of historical designation for the monument. CM Peluso expressed support for the security measures taken while removing the monument, and noted that Mayor Deegan campaigned on the removal issue.

CP Salem said he feels that the removal was an overstep on the part of the Mayor, encroaching on council authority.

CM Howland spoke on behalf of this bill.

Rebecca Williams, Founder and Chief Executive Officer of Fruit of Barren Trees, LLC, a neighborhood revitalization firm, was in attendance to answer questions. The bill removes FBOT Pipeline from the non-compliance list. Their Grant Agreement (\$165,000 for the Green District Phase I Affordable Housing Project in Durkeville) required that the nonprofit entity obtain and maintain all permits required by the State of Florida, but FBOT inadvertently failed to comply with this requirement and as a result of the non-compliance, the company is ineligible to receive reimbursement payments.
