CP Salem explained the bill. CM Freeman asked for a list of organizations on the non-compliance list. Mr. Peterson said he will provide the list to the committee, which consists of roughly 30 nonprofits. CM Johnson asked about forgiveness for other entities on the list, specifically as related to seven nonprofits that applied for mini-grants from the Safety and Crime Reduction Commission. CM Freeman asked to be added as a co-sponsor.

CM Freeman expressed excitement that this initiative is moving forward. CM J. Carlucci said it is much needed.

CM Boylan said the Council has been devolving in recent years to more and more district-specific projects being funded out of contingency accounts outside of the normal appropriation process. He recommends developing a formal process to make this happen in a transparent and consistent way without the need for so many waivers. CM Freeman explained the difference between the City and School Board fiscal years and the good work this program does.

• Amends Code Sec. 112.307 to require written approval of the appropriate Constitutional Officer (Sheriff, Clerk of Court, Property Appraiser, Tax Collector, or Supervisor of Elections) for settlements over \$10,000 (claims and suits against the City, whether in litigation or not, that are not covered by the Self-Insurance Program)

#### AUDITOR COMMENTS/CONCERNS:

• Requiring approval of a Constitutional Officer adds another layer to what is currently a business decision made by experts in the field of risk management that is designed to promote fiscal responsibility and protect the City

• Unfavorable financial outcomes resulting from the decision to go to trial versus settle will ultimately be borne by the City, not the applicable Constitutional Officer

• The City maintains excess insurance coverage for claims in excess of the self-insured retention amount. Per Risk Management, there may be negative impacts to the City's excess insurance coverage (such as denial of coverage or increased rates) if Constitutional Officers are required to approve settlements.

• As proposed, the legislation does not provide the same settlement approval rights to

1) individual Council Members, who are also Constitutional Officers

2) City employees not reporting to a Constitutional Officer

Trista Carraher, Auditor's Office, explained the amendment. CM White asked to be added as a co-sponsor.

There was a lengthy discussion on this bill, which pertains to a Code amendment to grant constitutional officers the authority to approve settlements of liability claims made against their agency/the City. CM Howland spoke in support of the bill, and called it a 'common sense' bill.

Lara Mattina, JSO, said that a recent settlement of a suit against the City, naming JSO, was made without the Sheriff's consultation making codification of approval necessary. She spoke of the degradation of public trust, and the defamation of the officer involved. She said that Risk

Management is not equipped to quantify reputational losses.

Gaby Young, OGC, explained White floor amendment #1.

CVP White offered floor amendment #1 that removes worker's compensation and property damage claims from the purview of constitutional officers approval, leaving only general liability claims. The White amendment #1 was approved by a voice vote 6-1 (CM Johnson opposed)

Anna Brosche, CFO, spoke about the claim settlement process and sovereign immunity. Ms. Brosche noted that per Ordinance Code, the Risk Manager has the authority to settle claims against the City. She acknowledged that there was a communication issue on this particular claim settlement that will not re-occur. Ms. Brosche indicated that the written approval from constitutional officers is the problem with this bill. She talked about compromised insurability, increased legal and insurance costs, and insurance concerns associated with shifting settlement approval to the constitutional officers. She talked about the potential increase of premiums, cancellation of coverage, and the risk of disclosure of private information and methods. She proposed constitutional officers conveying their concurrence or non-concurrence instead of approval/disapproval.

CM Boylan asked the Auditors if the amendment fixes their concerns. Mr. Peterson said it addresses some but not all of the Auditor's concerns.

CP Salem noted a disconnection with the Administration and the Sheriff because no notice was given on the monument removal.

CM J. Carlucci asked about average settlement claims for JSO, and contributions to the risk management fund by JSO. He shared his doubts that coverage will be cancelled.

Mr. Peterson explained that JSO doesn't generate funds, the money for their claims come from the general fund and flow to JSO and then to Risk Management.

Tracy Flynn, Risk Manager, spoke about the City's excess liability insurance.

Josh Becksmith and Brenda Lewis-Lipscomb, Brown and Brown, talked about the adjudication of claims and the number of firms that provide coverage to large municipalities. Mr. Becksmith mentioned increases in 'nuclear verdicts' in last 5 years.

CM Amaro suggested constitutional officer collaboration in the settlement process, but not approval authority. He expressed concerns that approval authority of one individual could negatively impact consequences of claims.

Jerry Holland, SOE, said that the bill addresses something that is not a systemic problem. He said that constitutional officers should not be responsible for deciding on settlements using public funds, and that they should be part of the conversation but not the deciding party.

CM Johnson talked about the potential risks of veto authority for constitutional officers. Ms. Mattina disputed the threat of veto authority and said it would be handled at the ballot box if misused. CM

Johnson expressed opposition 1 person having veto power over settlements.

CM Boylan talked about exposure to individual officers and whether officers would be involved in making settlement choices. Sheriff Waters spoke about how settlement decisions are made. Sean Granatt, OGC said officers give their input on settlement decisions.

CM Freeman asked about other cities and the unique nature of consolidated government. He asked who decides to go to trial versus settling. Mr. Granatt said that decision is made by Risk Management, the CFO, and OGC. CM Freeman asked about the legal costs for trials, which depends if an employee was acting in good faith in duties of their job. Mr. Granatt said if the City thinks the employee acted properly within the scope of their job, the City defends the employee. If the jury finds the employee guilty and rules they did not act properly within their scope, the employee is liable for the judgment. CM J. Carlucci said the City should litigate more and settle less, if there is evidence of no wrong doing.

CM White asked Jerry Holland if he is OK with the proposed amendment. Mr. Holland said it's a good solution because it involves the constitutional officer in the process, which is most important.

CVP White offered floor amendment #2 for city council to make the final decision on liability claim settlements if the CFO, Risk Manger and Constitutional Officer do not agree. Ms. Young talked about Sunshine Law implications, and shade meetings associated with litigation discussions. The White floor amendment #2 was approved by a voice vote 6-1 (Johnson opposed).

All 3 amendments will be rolled into 1 Rules amendment.
