Presentation on Procurement Bill 2023-20

Lawsikia Hodges, OGC, gave a presentation on 2023-20 (first introduced by CM Cumber in January 2023) and she explained how it revises the City's Procurement Code. Ms. Hodges provided an historical overview of Jacksonville's consolidation and the role of centralized services. At the time of consolidation in 1968, central services included the motor pool, personnel, communications, legal, public relations and purchasing.

Ms. Hodges described CM Cumber's goals when working on the drafting of this bill. She said that the intent was to streamline the process and scope of the award committees and move toward the utilization of modern procurement technologies. Additionally, the bill seeks to add more transparency/accountability to contract administration.

With the changes made through this bill, the Jacksonville Procurement Code will be referred to as the Jax P-Code, and the award committees will change to one (Jacksonville Procurement Awards Committee - JPAC) instead of 3 with revised membership to include the Directors of Finance and Public Works, and the City's Risk Manager. The Chief of Procurement will provide administrative support, with legal support provided by OGC.

CM Gay said he supports the bill and that the update to the Procurement Code is greatly needed to modernize the system.

CM Lahnen asked about the applicability to formal vs. informal purchases, and Ms. Hodges explained the thresholds for each.

CM Freeman asked about the role of the Ombudsman, and the conflict of that position reporting to the Chief of Procurement since they mediate contract disputes between the City and suppliers. He asked if that is something that could possibly be added to the bill as an amendment. Ms. Hodges said that the Ombudsman is not addressed in the bill, but that policy change could be added as an amendment if desired. CM Freeman did not offer it as an amendment at this time. CM Peluso asked if the Mayor supports the bill (Ms. Norris indicated the affirmative), and he asked if the independent agencies use the same Procurement Code as the City (JHFA does but not the others because they are distinct entities). CM Boylan suggested using completion timelines as a benchmark for efficiency, in particular to measure improvements if this bill is approved and the changes are implemented.

Phillip Peterson, Auditor's Office, explained the amendment and the emergency.

CM Freeman asked about capturing the JIA CRA funds for projects in that area, or extending the sunset date. Carla Lopera, OGC, said there are certain requirements to extend a CRA, per state statute, including a blight study.

Karen Nasrallah, OED, provided background on state requirements for CRAs and how extending the sunset date is not an option. She noted that, per the state, all CRAs will sunset by 2038-39.
