There was discussion about this bill as related to the history of housing policies and the effects of redlining. CM Peluso spoke on behalf of the bill and explained the intent to acknowledge history and the disparate and ongoing impact of redlining in Jacksonville. He noted that the infrastructure issues in the redlined neighborhoods persist today.

CM Amaro asked about specific methods alluded to in the bill to redress the effects of redlining. CM Peluso said he has discussed it with the Administration. He also said he hopes that policies for equal access to neighborhood improvements and home ownership to all citizens, regardless of race, can be incorporated into future council legislation.

CM Freeman talked about past council's inactivity on this issue.

Mr. Delaney, Mayor's Office, talked about some of the Mayor's brainstorming about this issue, such as possibly weighting CIP projects for infrastructure improvements in these areas. CM Peluso talked about the benefits of homeownership as a means to build generational wealth.

CM J. Carlucci asked about contemporary examples of discriminatory behavior in lending or housing policy. CM Peluso talked about a 2020 example of differing appraisals with a mixed-race couple in Jacksonville whose home in had initially been valued by an appraiser at \$330,000 but the same residence was valued at more than 40 percent higher at a second appraisal after they removed images of their Black family members.

CM Peluso explained the differences in the city based on zip code, as related to income, jobs, access to capital, mobility, and health. He talked about the GI Bill and VA loans after WWII which were administered by states and not distributed equally to veterans of color.

CM Boylan expressed support for the bill and recommended reading JCCI race relations report from 2002 and 2008. He highlighted the role of the private sector in redressing the effects of redlining.

CM Johnson talked about the recent Ameris Bank settlement and the importance of acknowledging the issue of redlining historically and the impact from those policies that persist.

CM Freeman mentioned free or discounted JTA passes for those working living wage jobs or attending apprenticeship programs.

CM Miller asked what comes next, and he said that future policies should address community needs as a whole as they exist today.

CM Boylan shared the discussion from the morning's NCSPHS meeting on this bill.

CM Amaro asked about the specific purpose of the study and the process for community engagement. CM Peluso spoke on behalf of the bill and the needs in the Durkeeville neighborhood, particularly for the 37 JHA properties whose residents may benefit from services. He talked about the need to gain trust from the community, the HUD Hope 6 grant that was not fully implemented, and the proximity of Durkeeville to the Emerald Trail.

CM Johnson made a comparison to the recent bill that passed to set aside council contingency funds for hiring legislative counsel selected without a competitive bid process. He also emphasized the responsibility of council to support marginalized communities.

Jerry Holland, SOE, was in attendance to speak about the need for this bill to meet new state requirements before the next election. He said he is often asked why they don't count votes by hand in every election. Mr. Holland explained that in 2020 there were 42 races, with 92 selection choices, on the ballot. He said it would have taken 5000 workers working 24 hours per day, 70 days to do a hand count in 2020. CM Johnson talked about unfunded state mandates, and the need for fair and equal access to voting.
